House Bill 2315

Sponsored by Representative GREENLICK (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Decreases transit system fee for elderly persons or persons with disabilities if mass transit district receives moneys from Elderly and Disabled Special Transportation Fund.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to mass transit districts; amending ORS 267.320.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. ORS 267.320 is amended to read:

267.320. (1) Except as otherwise provided in this section, to carry out the powers granted by ORS 267.010 to 267.390, the [district] board of directors of a mass transit district established under ORS 267.010 to 267.390 may by ordinance impose and may collect user charges, fees and tolls from those who are served by or use the transit system and other facilities and services of the district.

- (2) The district [shall] **may** not charge a person over 65 years of age a fee of more than 50 percent of the regular fee for transportation provided by the district. The maximum fee established by this subsection does not apply on any weekday, Monday through Friday, between the hours of 5 a.m. and 9 a.m. or between the hours of 3 p.m. and 7 p.m.
- (3) Notwithstanding subsection (2) of this section, the district may not charge a person over 65 years of age or a person with a disability a fee of more than 35 percent of the regular fee for transportation provided by the district if the district receives moneys from the Elderly and Disabled Special Transportation Fund established under ORS 391.800. The maximum fee established by this subsection does not apply on any weekday, Monday through Friday, between the hours of 5 a.m. and 9 a.m. or between the hours of 3 p.m. and 7 p.m.
