## A-Engrossed House Bill 2371

Ordered by the House April 15 Including House Amendments dated April 15

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Requires Oregon Health Authority to adopt rules requiring entity that administers vaccines and receives vaccines from authority to report to immunization registry and certify that employees have completed training session.

Directs authority to adopt rules exempting entity from certification requirement if entity imposes adequate training requirements on employees.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to immunization; and declaring an emergency.

**3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:** 

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) The Oregon Health Authority shall adopt rules requiring an entity that

5 administers vaccines and receives vaccines from the authority to:

6 (a) Report information about the administration of the vaccine to the immunization 7 registry created under ORS 433.094; and

8 (b) At least once every two years, certify that employees of the entity have completed a 9 training session approved by the authority on the storage, handling and administration of 10 vaccines. The authority may not require more than two employees of an entity to complete 11 the training session.

(2) The authority shall adopt rules exempting an entity from the requirements of subsection (1)(b) of this section if the entity demonstrates to the satisfaction of the authority that the entity or a health licensing board imposes adequate training requirements on employees of the entity.

16 <u>SECTION 2.</u> This 2011 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 17 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2011 Act takes effect 18 on its passage.
