

House Bill 2371

Sponsored by Representative NATHANSON; Representative GREENLICK (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Requires Oregon Health Authority to adopt rules requiring entity that administers vaccines and receives vaccines from authority to report to immunization registry and certify that employees have completed training session.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to immunization; and declaring an emergency.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1. The Oregon Health Authority shall adopt rules requiring an entity that ad-**
5 **ministers vaccines and receives vaccines from the authority to:**

6 **(1) Report information about the administration of the vaccine to the immunization reg-**
7 **istry created under ORS 433.094; and**

8 **(2) At least once every two years, certify that employees of the entity have completed a**
9 **training session approved by the authority on the storage, handling and administration of**
10 **vaccines. The authority may not require more than two employees of an entity to complete**
11 **the training session.**

12 **SECTION 2. This 2011 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public**
13 **peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2011 Act takes effect**
14 **on its passage.**
