SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Establishes Task Force on Health Professional Regulatory Boards to review role of health professional regulatory boards.

Sunsets February 4, 2013.

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Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

- 2 Relating to regulation of health professional licensing boards; and declaring an emergency.
 - Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
 - <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) The Task Force on Health Professional Regulatory Boards is established, consisting of seven members appointed by the Governor.
 - (2) The task force shall review the role of health professional regulatory boards in this state.
 - (3) A majority of the voting members of the task force constitutes a quorum for the transaction of business.
 - (4) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a majority of the voting members of the task force.
 - (5) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as chairperson.
 - (6) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the Governor shall make an appointment to become immediately effective.
 - (7) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the call of the chairperson or of a majority of the voting members of the task force.
 - (8) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of the task force.
 - (9) The task force shall submit a report, and may include recommendations for legislation, to an interim committee of the Legislative Assembly related to health care no later than October 1, 2012.
 - (10) Members of the task force are not entitled to compensation and serve as volunteers.
 - (11) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are directed to assist the task force in the performance of its duties and, to the extent permitted by laws relating to confidentiality, to furnish such information and advice as the members of the task force consider necessary to perform their duties.
 - SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2011 Act is repealed on February 4, 2013.
 - SECTION 3. This 2011 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2011 Act takes effect on its passage.

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
