House Bill 2460

Sponsored by Representative GELSER (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Exempts alcohol or drug treatment providers from requirement to report elder abuse and from criminal records check requirement. Repeals sunset on exemption of alcohol or drug treatment providers from disqualification based on criminal conviction.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

- 5 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
- 6 **SECTION 1.** ORS 124.050 is amended to read:
- 7 124.050. As used in ORS 124.050 to 124.095:
- 8 (1) "Abuse" means one or more of the following:
- 9 (a) Any physical injury to an elderly person caused by other than accidental means, or which
- 10 appears to be at variance with the explanation given of the injury.
- 11 (b) Neglect.

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- 12 (c) Abandonment, including desertion or willful forsaking of an elderly person or the withdrawal
- 13 or neglect of duties and obligations owed an elderly person by a caretaker or other person.
- 14 (d) Willful infliction of physical pain or injury upon an elderly person.
- (e) An act that constitutes a crime under ORS 163.375, 163.405, 163.411, 163.415, 163.425, 163.427,
 163.465 or 163.467.

- 17 (f) Verbal abuse.
- 18 (g) Financial exploitation.

19 (h) Sexual abuse.

(i) Involuntary seclusion of an elderly person for the convenience of a caregiver or to disciplinethe person.

(j) A wrongful use of a physical or chemical restraint of an elderly person, excluding an act of
 restraint prescribed by a licensed physician and any treatment activities that are consistent with
 an approved treatment plan or in connection with a court order.

(2) "Elderly person" means any person 65 years of age or older who is not subject to the provisions of ORS 441.640 to 441.665.

8	(c) Misappropriating, misusing or transferring without authorization any money from any ac-
9	count held jointly or singly by an elderly person or a person with a disability.
10	(d) Failing to use the income or assets of an elderly person or a person with a disability effec-
11	tively for the support and maintenance of the person.
12	(5) "Intimidation" means compelling or deterring conduct by threat.
13	(6) "Law enforcement agency" means:
14	(a) Any city or municipal police department.

16	(c) The Oregon State Police.

18	(7) "Neglect" means:
19	(a) Failure to provide the care, supervision or services necessary to maintain the physical and
20	mental health of an elderly person that may result in physical harm or significant emotional harm

22	(b) The failure of a caregiver to make a reasonable effort to protect an elderly person from
23	abuse.
24	(8) "Person with a disability" means a person described in:

28	(a) Physician, naturopathic physician, osteopathic physician, chiropractor, physician assistant

31	or employee of an in-home health service.

9	(A) Sexual contact with an elderly person who does not consent or is considered incapable of
10	consenting to a sexual act under ORS 163.315;
11	(B) Sexual harassment, sexual exploitation or inappropriate exposure to sexually explicit mate-
12	rial or language;
13	(C) Any sexual contact between an employee of a facility or paid caregiver and an elderly per-
14	son served by the facility or caregiver;
15	(D) Any sexual contact between an elderly person and a relative of the elderly person other
16	than a spouse; or
17	(E) Any sexual contact that is achieved through force, trickery, threat or coercion.
18	(b) "Sexual abuse" does not mean consensual sexual contact between an elderly person and a
19	paid caregiver who is the spouse of the elderly person.
20	(12) "Sexual contact" has the meaning given that term in ORS 163.305.
21	(13) "Verbal abuse" means to threaten significant physical or emotional harm to an elderly
22	person or a person with a disability through the use of:
23	(a) Derogatory or inappropriate names, insults, verbal assaults, profanity or ridicule; or
24	(b) Harassment, coercion, threats, intimidation, humiliation, mental cruelty or inappropriate
25	sexual comments.

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1 <u>SECTION 3.</u> Section 15, chapter 93, Oregon Laws 2010, is repealed.

2 SECTION 4. (1) If this 2011 Act does not become effective until after July 1, 2011, section

3 3 of this 2011 Act (repealing section 15, chapter 93, Oregon Laws 2010) is repealed.

4 (2) If this 2011 Act does not become effective until after July 1, 2011, this 2011 Act shall 5 be operative retroactively to July 1, 2011.

6 <u>SECTION 5.</u> This 2011 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 7 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2011 Act takes effect 8 on its passage.

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
