HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 2466

On page 1 of the printed bill, delete lines 4 through 31 and insert:

"SECTION 1. The Legislative Assembly finds that the sending of unsolicited facsimiles
without obtaining the recipient's request or agreement to receive facsimiles constitutes a
waste and misuse of paper and public and private resources. The Legislative Assembly de-
clares that it is in the public interest to establish a prohibition on the sending of unsolicited
facsimiles to persons in this state unless the persons specifically request or agree to receive

identified facsimiles.

"SECTION 2. (1) A person may not send an unsolicited facsimile to another person in this state unless the other person has specifically requested or agreed to receive the facsimile. A person may not consider a prior business relationship with the other person to constitute agreement to receive a facsimile under this section.

- "(2) A person that violates subsection (1) of this section commits an unlawful practice under ORS 646.608 that is subject to enforcement and penalty as provided in ORS 646.605 to 646.652.
- "(3) In addition to any other penalty provided by law, the Attorney General may bring an action in the name of this state against any person for violation of this section. Upon proof by a preponderance of the evidence of a violation of this section, a person shall pay a civil penalty of not more than \$500 for each violation.
- "(4) Civil penalties authorized by this section must be imposed in the manner provided in ORS 183.745.
- "(5)(a) All sums collected as penalties under this section shall be first applied toward reimbursement of costs incurred in determining the violations, conducting hearings and collecting penalties.
- "(b) The remainder, if any, of the sums collected as penalties under this section must be paid over to the Department of State Lands for the benefit of the Common School Fund of this state.
 - "(6) As used in this section:
- "(a) 'Facsimile' means a communication sent by means of a facsimile machine, as that term is defined in ORS 646A.360.
- "(b) 'Person' means any individual, private or public corporation, partnership, cooperative, association, estate, limited liability company, organization or other entity, whether or not organized to operate at a profit, or a public body as defined in ORS 174.109.".

On page 2, delete lines 1 through 3.

On page 4, line 38, delete "to public bodies".
