

House Bill 2594

Sponsored by Representative SCHAUFLER (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Directs Department of Transportation to suspend person's commercial driver license if person, while operating bus, commits offense of operating motor vehicle while using mobile communication device.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to commercial driving privileges.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2011 Act is added to and made a part of the Oregon Vehicle**
5 **Code.**

6 **SECTION 2. (1) The driver of a commercial motor vehicle is subject to suspension of the**
7 **driver's commercial driver license upon conviction of operating a motor vehicle while using**
8 **a mobile communication device under ORS 811.507 if the person was operating a bus at the**
9 **time of the offense.**

10 **(2) Upon receipt of a record of conviction for an offense described in subsection (1) of this**
11 **section, the Department of Transportation shall suspend the convicted person's commercial**
12 **driver license for the following periods of time:**

13 **(a) Sixty days, upon receipt of a first record of conviction.**

14 **(b) One hundred and twenty days, if commission of a second offense and the conviction**
15 **for a separate offense occur within a three-year period.**

16 **(c) One year, if commission of a third or subsequent offense and two or more convictions**
17 **for separate offenses occur within a three-year period.**

18 **(3) A person is entitled to administrative review under ORS 809.440 of a suspension under**
19 **this section.**

20 **SECTION 3. Section 2 of this 2011 Act applies to offenses that occur on or after the ef-**
21 **fective date of this 2011 Act.**
