## **B-Engrossed** House Bill 2750

Ordered by the Senate May 27 Including House Amendments dated April 15 and Senate Amendments dated May 27

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure

Allows district school board to adopt policy for use of alcoholic beverages as ingredient in food preparation or in culinary arts classes taught at secondary schools of school district. Establishes requirements of policy.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to use of alcoholic beverages in schools; and declaring an emergency.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

- 4 SECTION 1. (1) As used in this section, "alcoholic beverage" has the meaning given that term in ORS 471.001. 5
- (2) A district school board may adopt a policy that allows the use of alcoholic beverages 6

7 in the secondary schools of the school district for the following purposes:

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(a) As ingredients in cooking or food preparation; and

- 9 (b) In a culinary arts class taught at a secondary school of the school district or in 10 preparation for a culinary competition or demonstration by the students of a secondary 11 school of the school district.
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(3) A policy adopted under this section must:

13 (a) Specify the circumstances under which the alcoholic beverages may be used;

(b) Require that the alcoholic beverages be used only while under adult supervision; 14

15(c) Require that the alcoholic beverages be securely stored while not in use;

16 (d) Require that the parent or legal guardian of each student participating in the culinary 17 arts class provide written consent for the student to use alcoholic beverages in the culinary

18 arts class; and

19 (e) Allow a student to participate in an alternative project if consent is not provided un-20der paragraph (d) of this subsection or if the student chooses not to participate in a project 21that requires the use of an alcoholic beverage.

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(4) A policy adopted under this section may allow for the use of alcoholic beverages:

23(a) At specified culinary competitions or demonstrations while requiring board approval

- for the use of alcoholic beverages in other culinary competitions or demonstrations; and 24
- 25(b) In specified culinary arts classes while not allowing for the use of alcoholic beverages 26in other culinary arts classes.

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1 SECTION 2. Section 3 of this 2011 Act is added to and made a part of ORS chapter 471.  $\mathbf{2}$ SECTION 3. (1) Notwithstanding ORS 471.410, an employee of a school district may make 3 alcoholic beverages available to a student in a culinary arts class for use in the culinary arts class if the alcoholic beverages are provided in compliance with a policy adopted under sec-4 tion 1 of this 2011 Act.  $\mathbf{5}$ 6 (2) Notwithstanding ORS 471.430, a student of a culinary arts class may have personal possession of alcoholic beverages for use in the culinary arts class if the student has pos-7session of the alcoholic beverages in compliance with a policy adopted under section 1 of this 8 9 2011 Act.

10 <u>SECTION 4.</u> This 2011 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 11 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2011 Act takes effect 12 on its passage.

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
