SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the

[Repeals Ballot Measure 67 (2010).]

Decreases corporate minimum tax to \$10. Discontinues corporate minimum tax for C corporations based on amount of Oregon sales. Decreases rate of corporate excise tax imposed on C corporations. Repeals \$150 entity tax on partnerships. Applies to tax years beginning on or after January 1, 2012.]
[Decreases filing fee for specified documents and reports delivered to Secretary of State. Decreases

maximum filing fee for financing statements and other records related to Uniform Commercial Code. Decreases application fee for appointment as notary public. Applies to documents and records filed, applications made and fees collected on or after effective date of Act.]

[Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.]

Authorizes State Board of Education to establish, by rule, fees related to administration of career schools. Increases current annual license fees for such schools. Authorizes collection of annual license fees until board first adopts rules. Eliminates annual license fees

Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2011.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to state finance; creating new provisions; amending ORS 345.080; and declaring an emer-3 gency.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. ORS 345.080 is amended to read:

345.080. (1) Before issuing any licenses under ORS 345.010 to 345.450, the Superintendent of Public Instruction shall collect the following nonrefundable, annual license fees:

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(2) Until the State Board of Education first adopts rules pursuant to ORS 345.080 as amended by section 2 of this 2011 Act, the Superintendent of Public Instruction may collect annual license fees established by ORS 345.080 as amended by section 1 of this 2011 Act.

SECTION 4. This 2011 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2011 Act takes effect July 1, 2011.
