SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Provides that only donor of body or body part may amend or revoke anatomical gift.

2	Relating to anatomical gifts; creating new provisions; and amending ORS 97.959 and 97.963.
3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. ORS 97.959 is amended to read:
5	97.959. (1) Except as provided in [subsection (7) of this section] ORS 97.963, an anatomical gift
6	made [by a designation on a donor's driver license or identification card] under ORS 97.957 [(1)(a)]
7	may be amended or revoked only by the donor in accordance with the provisions of this section
8	and may not be amended or revoked by any other person otherwise authorized to make, amend or
9	revoke a gift under ORS 97.963 or 97.967 or this section.
10	(2) [Except as provided in subsection (1) of this section and ORS 97.963,] A donor [or other person
11	authorized to make an anatomical gift under ORS 97.955] may amend or revoke an anatomical gift
12	by:
13	(a) A record signed by:
14	(A) The donor; or
15	[(B) The other person; or]
16	[(C)] (B) Subject to subsection (3) of this section, another individual acting at the direction of
17	the donor [or the other person] if the donor [or other person] is physically unable to sign; or
18	(b) A later-executed document of gift that amends or revokes a previous anatomical gift or por-
19	tion of an anatomical gift, either expressly or by inconsistency.
20	(3) A record signed pursuant to subsection $[(2)(a)(C)]$ (2)(a)(B) of this section must:
21	(a) Be witnessed by at least two adults, at least one of whom is a disinterested witness, who
22	have signed at the request of the donor [or the other person]; and
23	(b) State that it has been signed and witnessed as required in this subsection.
24	(4) [Except as provided in ORS 97.963,] A donor [or other person authorized to make an anatom-
25	ical gift under ORS 97.955] may revoke an anatomical gift by the destruction or cancellation of the

document of gift, or the portion of the document of gift used to make the gift, with the intent to revoke the gift.

(5) A donor may amend or revoke an anatomical gift that was not made in a will by any form
of communication during a terminal illness or injury addressed to at least two adults, at least one
of whom is a disinterested witness.

(6) A donor who makes an anatomical gift in a will may amend or revoke the gift in the manner
 provided for amendment or revocation of wills or as provided in subsection (4) of this section.

1 [(7) If a donor who is an unemancipated minor dies, a parent of the donor who is reasonably 2 available may revoke or amend an anatomical gift of the donor's body or body part.]

3 **SECTION 2.** ORS 97.963 is amended to read:

97.963. (1) An anatomical gift of a donor's body or body part, if the donor or another person made an anatomical gift of the donor's body or body part under ORS 97.957 or an amendment to an anatomical gift of the donor's body or body part under ORS 97.959, may not be revoked except in accordance with ORS 97.959.

8 (2) A donor's revocation of an anatomical gift of the donor's body or body part under ORS 97.959
9 is not a refusal and does not prohibit another person specified in ORS 97.955 or 97.965 from making
10 an anatomical gift of the donor's body or body part under ORS 97.957 or 97.967.

(3) If a person other than the donor makes an unrevoked anatomical gift of the donor's body or
body part under ORS 97.957 [or an amendment to an anatomical gift of the donor's body or body part
under ORS 97.959], another person may not make, amend or revoke the gift of the donor's body or
body part under ORS 97.967.

[(4) A revocation of an anatomical gift of a donor's body or body part under ORS 97.959 by a
person other than the donor does not prohibit another person from making an anatomical gift of the
body or body part under ORS 97.957 or 97.967.]

[(5)] (4) In the absence of an express, contrary indication by the donor or other person authorized to make an anatomical gift under ORS 97.955, an anatomical gift of a body part is neither a refusal to give another body part nor a limitation on the making of an anatomical gift of another body part at a later time by the donor or other person.

[(6)] (5) In the absence of an express, contrary indication by the donor or other person authorized to make an anatomical gift under ORS 97.955, an anatomical gift of a body part for one or more of the purposes set forth in ORS 97.955 is not a limitation on the making of an anatomical gift of the body part for any of the other purposes by the donor or other person under ORS 97.957 or 97.967.

27 <u>SECTION 3.</u> The amendments to ORS 97.959 and 97.963 by sections 1 and 2 of this 2011 28 Act apply to anatomical gift amendments and revocations made on or after the effective date 29 of this 2011 Act.
