SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

[Establishes Task Force on State Historical Resources to develop plans for coordination among

agencies and institutions dedicated to preserving Oregon history.] [Sunsets task force on date of convening of 2013 regular legislative session.] Adds Coordinator of State Historical Records Advisory Board or designee to Oregon Heritage Commission as nonvoting member. Specifies that only voting members of commission may be reimbursed for actual and necessary expenses.

Adds development of plans for coordination among agencies and organizations dedicated to preserving Oregon historical records to duties of commission.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

4	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
5	SECTION 1. ORS 358.570 is amended to read:
6	358.570. (1) [To assure the conservation and development of Oregon's heritage] There is established
7	in the State Parks and Recreation Department the Oregon Heritage Commission consisting of nine
8	voting members appointed by the Governor and [eight ex officio] nine advisory members, as de-
9	scribed in ORS 358.575.
10	(2)(a) The term of office of each voting member is four years, but a member serves at the
11	pleasure of the Governor.
12	(b) Before the expiration of the term of a member, the Governor shall appoint a successor whose
13	term begins on July 1 next following.
14	(c) A member is eligible for reappointment.
15	(d) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the Governor shall make an appointment to become
16	immediately effective for the unexpired term.
17	(3) A voting member of the commission is entitled to actual and necessary travel and other
18	expenses as provided in ORS 292.495.
19	SECTION 2. ORS 358.575 is amended to read:
20	358.575. (1) The voting members of the Oregon Heritage Commission shall be [composed of] rep-
21	resentatives of:
22	(a) Heritage interests, including Indian tribes with federal recognition, that reflect the cultural
23	and geographic diversity of this state; and
24	(b) [as well as the] Heritage interests reflected in community institutions, libraries, museums,

2	(2) The [ex officio] advisory members of the commission shall be [designees of the following]:
3	(a) One member designated by the Director of the Department of Land Conservation and
4	Development;
5	(b) One member designated by the Trustees of the State Library;
6	(c) One member designated by the State Board of Higher Education;
7	(d) One member designated by the Oregon [Business Development Department] Tourism
8	Commission;
9	(e) [The Department of Education] One member designated by the Superintendent of Public
10	Instruction;
11	(f) The Executive Director of the Oregon Historical Society or a designee of the executive
12	director;
13	(g) The State Archivist or a designee of the archivist; [and]

18	358.595. (1) The Oregon Heritage Commission is [designated] the primary agency for coordi-

20	that express an interest in the heritage of Oregon.
21	(2) The commission shall:
22	[(1)] (a) Prepare and adopt an Oregon Heritage Plan to [address coordination for] coordinate the
23	identification, curation, restoration and interpretation of heritage resources.
24	[(2)] (b) Increase efficiency and avoid duplication among the various interest groups that seek
25	to preserve heritage resources.
26	(c) Pursuant to section 4 of this 2011 Act, develop plans for coordination among agencies
27	and organizations dedicated to preserving Oregon historical records.
28	[(3)] (d) Coordinate a comprehensive inventory of state-owned cultural properties and make the
29	inventory available to the public.
30	[(4)] (e) In conjunction with the Oregon Business Development Department encourage tourism
31	activities relating to heritage resources.
32	[(5)] (f) Coordinate statewide anniversary celebrations.
33	[(6)] (g) Coordinate statewide celebrations of Asian American Heritage Month.
34	SECTION 4. (1) The Oregon Heritage Commission shall:
35	(a) Periodically review the authority, duties and mission of the commission, the State
36	Archives, the State Library and the State Historical Records Advisory Board;
37	(b) Establish a schedule of semiannual joint meetings of representatives of the agencies
38	listed in paragraph (a) of this subsection to define the duties of each agency and to ensure
39	collaboration, and reduce overlap, among the agencies;
40	(c) Solicit, from the State Historical Records Advisory Board and other agencies and or-
41	ganizations dedicated to the preservation of Oregon history, a five-year plan and arrange for
42	the agencies and organizations to review their plans jointly to define the duties of each
43	agency and organization, to ensure collaboration, and reduce overlap, among the agencies
44	and organizations and to consider regionalization and assistance to rural communities; and
45	(d) Develop a plan for centralized coordination of requests for funding from, and awards

1 of grants to, local agencies and organizations dedicated to the preservation of Oregon his-2 tory.

3 (2) The State Archives shall provide staff support for the duties of the Oregon Heritage
4 Commission under this section.

5 <u>SECTION 5.</u> (1) Except as provided in subsection (2) of this section, the amendments to 6 ORS 358.575 by section 2 of this 2011 Act do not affect the terms of office of the current 7 members of the Oregon Heritage Commission and apply to membership positions on the 8 commission only as vacancies occur.

9 (2) Pursuant to ORS 358.575 (2)(d), as amended by section 2 of this 2011 Act, the Oregon
10 Tourism Commission shall designate a member of the Oregon Heritage Commission to begin
11 service no later than January 1, 2013.

12 <u>SECTION 6.</u> This 2011 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 13 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2011 Act takes effect 14 on its passage.
