House Bill 2932

Sponsored by Representative HOLVEY (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Requires Oregon Department of Administrative Services to develop and implement plans establishing four-day, 10-hour-per-day workweek for state employees. Creates exceptions. Requires department to report biannually to Legislative Assembly results of implementation of four-day workweek.

- Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
 - <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1)(a) The regular office hours of all state agencies shall be 7 a.m. to 6 p.m., Monday through Thursday. Offices of state agencies shall be closed on Fridays.
 - (b) Paragraph (a) of this subsection does not apply to a state agency that provides essential services that are required during hours of operation other than those specified in paragraph (a) of this subsection.
 - (2)(a) The Oregon Department of Administrative Services shall develop and implement a plan for each state agency that establishes regular working hours for employees of the state agency subject to the plan on the basis of a four-day, 10-hour-per-day workweek.
 - (b) The department shall adopt rules for implementation of the plans required under this subsection that include, but are not limited to:
 - (A) A process for identifying those state agencies that provide essential services and that require hours of operation other than those specified in subsection (1)(a) of this section;
 - (B) A provision specifying that if a holiday occurs on a day an employee subject to a plan is scheduled to work, the employee shall be granted 10 hours of paid holiday leave; and
 - (C) An operational strategy that ensures the optimal use of state agency buildings by:
 - (i) Maximizing the efficient use of heating, air-conditioning and lighting systems;
 - (ii) Targeting systems to support only the occupied zones in partially occupied buildings; and
 - (iii) Locating state agency essential operations in shared facilities to ensure the most efficient use of resources.
 - (3) For purposes of this section, "state agency" means every state officer and board, commission, department, institution, branch and agency of the state government whose costs are paid wholly or in part from funds held in the State Treasury, except:
 - (a) The Legislative Assembly, the courts, the district attorney for each county and their officers and committees; and
 - (b) The Public Defense Services Commission.
 - SECTION 2. (1) The Oregon Department of Administrative Services shall report to the

- Legislative Assembly the results of the implementation of the plans required under section 1 of this 2011 Act on or before January 15 and June 30 of each year. The reports required under this subsection shall be made in the manner provided by ORS 192.245.
- (2) The reports required by this section shall include, but are not limited to, an evaluation of the effect of the implementation of a four-day, 10-hour-per-day workweek on:
 - (a) Energy usage at state facilities subject to a plan;
 - (b) Morale and productivity of state workers subject to a plan;
- (c) Customer satisfaction with the operating hours of the state agencies subject to a plan; and
 - (d) Utilization of online resources provided by the state agencies subject to a plan.
