House Bill 3016

Sponsored by Representative THATCHER (at the request of Mike Foster)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Increases time in advance of graduation that applicant may take fundamentals in engineering examination, subject to discretion of State Board of Examiners for Engineering and Land Surveying.

1	A BILL FOR AN ACT
2	Relating to examinations for licensed professions; amending ORS 670.010 and 670.020.
3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. ORS 670.010 is amended to read:
5	670.010. Any state board or commission that examines applicants for license or certification to
6	practice a profession or engage in a trade or calling may, [in its discretion] at the discretion of the
7	board or commission, waive the educational requirement for admission to [such examination, pro-
8	vided that] the examination if the applicant furnishes evidence satisfactory to [such state] the board
9	or commission that:
10	(1) Except as provided in subsection (2) of this section, the applicant:
11	(a) Is currently enrolled in a school, college or university approved by [such state] the board
12	or commission;
13	(b) [and] Will satisfy the educational requirement for admission [to such examination] on satis-
14	factory completion of courses for which the applicant is currently enrolled; and
15	(c) Will satisfy the educational requirement for admission no [and that this educational re-
16	quirement will be met not] later than four calendar months from the first day of the month following
17	the month in which the examination is given.
18	(2) For the fundamentals in engineering examination described in ORS 672.105, the ap-
19	plicant:
20	(a) Is currently enrolled in a school, college or university program approved by the State
21	Board of Examiners for Engineering and Land Surveying;
22	(b) Will satisfy the educational requirement for admission on satisfactory completion of
23	a degree program in which the applicant is currently enrolled; and
24	(c) Will satisfy the educational requirement for admission no later than 10 calendar
25	months from the first day of the month following the month in which the examination is
26	given.
27	SECTION 2. ORS 670.020 is amended to read:
28	670.020. (1) Evidence of completion of [the] an educational requirement waived as provided in
29	ORS 670.010 (1) shall be filed with [such] the appropriate state board or commission not later than
30	four calendar months from the first day of the month following the month in which the examination
31	is taken. Evidence of completion of an educational requirement waived as provided in ORS

670.010 (2) shall be filed not later than 10 calendar months from the first day of the month 1 $\mathbf{2}$ following the month in which the examination is taken. State boards and commissions shall 3 withhold official certification of the successful completion of the examination until such evidence is furnished. The affidavit of the registrar or administrative head of the school, college or university 4 $\mathbf{5}$ shall be deemed satisfactory evidence. 6 (2) If any candidate admitted to an examination as provided in ORS 670.010 shall fail or neglect 7within said period to complete the educational requirement for such examination, then the com-8 pletion of the examination by such candidate shall be null and void, and of no effect. The state board

9 or commission which examined the candidate, however, shall retain any examination fee paid by the
