House Bill 3118

Sponsored by Representative DEMBROW; Representative HUFFMAN

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Modifies higher education reporting requirements regarding differences in compensation between faculty categories. Requires reporting on student access to faculty outside of class.

2	Relating to higher education faculty; amending ORS 351.708.
3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. ORS 351.708 is amended to read:
5	351.708. (1) The State Board of Education and the State Board of Higher Education shall es-
6	tablish baselines and conduct annual reviews of each public institution of higher education with
7	respect to the employment of full-time faculty [and of faculty working less than full-time], the em-
8	ployment of part-time faculty and student access to full-time and part-time faculty. Each
9	public institution of higher education shall provide the necessary data for the board's report prior
10	to September 1 of each year. The boards shall report the results of the reviews to the Legislative
11	Assembly and the Governor's office prior to October 1 of each year. The reviews shall include:
12	[(1)] (a) Examination of data for each term in the preceding year on a student full-time
13	equivalent basis related to the ratio of courses taught by the following faculty categories:
14	[(a)] (A) Full-time faculty;
15	[(b)] (B) Part-time faculty; and

- [(b)] (B) Part-time faculty; and
- [(c)] (C) Graduate assistants;
- [(2)] (b) The pay differential for the faculty categories, adjusted for the difference in full-time equivalent status; [and]
 - [(3)] (c) The health care and other benefits provided for each faculty category[.]; and
 - (d) Institutional practices regarding:
- (A) Access of students to members of each faculty category outside of class, through regular office hours or through alternative forms of access;
- (B) Differences in student access to members of each faculty category outside of class; and
- (C) Compensation of members of each faculty category for required or recommended student access outside of class.
- (2) For the purposes of this section, "student full-time equivalent" means the number of students taught by a member of each faculty category in the faculty member's courses, adjusted for the status of the faculty member as a full-time or part-time employee.
