SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Removes exception for person operating motor vehicle in scope of person's employment from offense of operating motor vehicle while using mobile communication device.

Provides exception for person operating tow vehicle, roadside assistance vehicle or vehicle owned or contracted by utility from offense of operating motor vehicle while using mobile commu-nication device. Removes volunteer requirement from exception to offense for person who is providing public safety services or emergency services.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Prohibits text communication while operating motor vehicle.

5	SECTION 1. ORS 811.507 is amended to read:
6	811.507. (1) As used in this section:
7	(a) "Hands-free accessory" means an attachment or built-in feature for or an addition to a mo-
8	bile communication device, whether or not permanently installed in a motor vehicle, that when used
9	allows a person to maintain both hands on the steering wheel.
10	(b) "Mobile communication device" means a text messaging device or a wireless, two-way com-
11	munication device designed to receive and transmit voice or text communication.
12	(2) A person commits the offense of operating a motor vehicle while using a mobile communi-
13	cation device if the person, while operating a motor vehicle on a highway, uses a mobile communi-
14	cation device.
15	(3) This section does not apply to a person who activates or deactivates a mobile commu-
16	nication device or a function of the device or who uses the device for voice communication
17	if the person:
18	(a) [To a person who] Is summoning medical or other emergency help if no other person in the
19	vehicle is capable of summoning help;
20	(b) [To a person] Is using a mobile communication device for the purpose of farming or agri-
21	cultural operations;
22	(c) [To a person] Is operating an ambulance or emergency vehicle;
23	(d) [To a person] Is 18 years of age or older [who] and is using a hands-free accessory;

(e) [To a person] Is operating a motor vehicle while providing public safety services or emer-1 gency services [as a volunteer]; 2 (f) [To a person] Is operating a motor vehicle while acting in the scope of the person's employ-3 ment as a public safety officer, as defined in ORS 348.270; 4 [(g) To a person operating a motor vehicle in the scope of the person's employment if operation of $\mathbf{5}$ the motor vehicle is necessary for the person's job;] 6 [(h) To a person activating or deactivating the mobile communication device or a function of the 7 device;] 8 9 (g) Is operating a tow vehicle or roadside assistance vehicle while acting in the scope of the person's employment; 10 [(i)] (h) [To a person who] Holds a valid amateur radio operator license issued or any other li-11 12 cense issued by the Federal Communications Commission and is operating an amateur radio; 13 [(j)] (i) [To a person who operates] Is operating a two-way radio device that transmits radio communication transmitted by a station operating on an authorized frequency within the citizens' 14 15or family radio service bands in accordance with rules of the Federal Communications Commission; 16[or](j) Is operating a vehicle owned or contracted by a utility for the purpose of installing, 17repairing, maintaining, operating or upgrading utility service, including but not limited to 18 natural gas, electricity, water or telecommunications, while acting in the scope of the 19 person's employment; or 20(k) [To a person] Is using a function of the mobile communication device that allows for only 2122one-way voice communication while the person is: 23(A) Operating a motor vehicle in the scope of the person's employment; (B) Providing transit services [to persons with disabilities or to senior citizens]; or 24(C) Participating in public safety or emergency service activities. 25(4) The offense described in this section, operating a motor vehicle while using a mobile com-2627munication device, is a Class D traffic violation.
