## House Bill 3226

Sponsored by Representative THOMPSON; Representatives FREEMAN, GARRARD, WEIDNER

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** 

Prohibits public body from requiring persons to participate in health care systems or prohibiting persons from paying health care providers directly for health care services.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to health.

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- 3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
  - SECTION 1. (1) As used in this section:
  - (a) "Compel" means encouraging or discouraging conduct through the use of penalties or fines.
    - (b) "Direct payment" means paying a provider of health care services directly for lawful health care services instead of a payment to a provider by a public or private third party or insurer. "Direct payment" includes payment to a provider by an employer for the cost of an employee's lawful health care services.
    - (c) "Health care system" means any public or private entity organized for the purpose of managing or processing health care services, data or information or for enrolling individuals in an organization that pays for or provides health care.
    - (d) "Lawful health care services" means any health-related service or treatment to the extent that the service or treatment is permitted or not prohibited by law and that is provided by a person authorized to provide such service or treatment.
    - (e) "Penalties or fines" means any civil or criminal penalty, fine, tax, salary or wage withholding, surcharge or any named fee with a similar effect established by law by a state or federal agency that is used to punish or discourage the exercise of rights protected under this section.
      - (f) "Public body" has the meaning given that term in ORS 174.109.
      - (2) A public body may not:
      - (a) Directly or indirectly compel a person to participate in any health care system;
    - (b) Prohibit any direct payment made to or accepted by a health care provider by imposing penalties or fines; or
    - (c) Subject to reasonable and necessary conditions that do not substantially limit a person's options, prohibit the purchase or sale of health insurance in private health care systems.
      - (3) This section does not affect:
      - (a) Which health care services a health care provider is required to perform or provide.
      - (b) Which health care services are permitted by law.

1 (c) Laws in effect on January 1, 2009.

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(d) The terms or conditions of any health care system if such terms and conditions do not have the effect of punishing direct payment by or to any person.

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
