House Bill 3236

Sponsored by Representatives DEMBROW, ESQUIVEL; Representatives BARKER, GELSER

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Directs Department of Education, Department of Community Colleges and Workforce Development and Bureau of Labor and Industries to collaborate on issues related to career and technical education.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to collaboration on education.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) Representatives from the Department of Education, the Department of 5 Community Colleges and Workforce Development and the Bureau of Labor and Industries 6 shall meet at least four times each year for the purpose of promoting collaboration between 7 the agencies on issues related to career and technical education.

8 (2) Issues to be addressed by the agencies shall include the development and implemen-9 tation of long-term goals that:

(a) Ensure that career and technical education programs are available at the public
 schools of this state, are founded on partnerships with business and industry and receive
 appropriate investments of time, money and other resources.

(b) Develop regional centers of partnerships between public schools, community colleges,
 state institutions of higher education, businesses, unions and other entities and ensure that
 every student of this state has access to a regional center in person or online.

(c) Implement accelerated college credit programs that allow students to move
 seamlessly from public schools to post-secondary education or training to the workforce.

(d) Increase professional development opportunities for instructors and learning oppor tunities for students through industry mentorships, internships, summer programs, after school programs and career-based student leadership opportunities.

(e) Establish partnerships between public and private entities for the purpose of educat ing students, parents, teachers, school advisors, policymakers and the general public about
 the benefits and opportunities related to career and technical education.

(3) The agencies identified in subsection (1) of this section shall make a joint report each
year to the appropriate legislative committees concerning progress on the development and
implementation of the goals described in subsection (2) of this section and may submit recommendations for legislation that will promote opportunities related to career and technical
education.

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
