

HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 3251

1 Delete lines 10 through 12 of the printed bill and insert:

2 “(3) Subsection (2) of this section does not prohibit disclosure of the records described in sub-
3 section (2) of this section to:

4 “(a) A law enforcement unit for purposes of the investigation;

5 “(b) An attorney representing a public safety officer who is the subject of the investigation;

6 “(c) The Department of Public Safety Standards and Training as required by ORS 181.675;

7 “(d) A district attorney, as defined in ORS 131.005;

8 “(e) A law enforcement officer, as defined in ORS 133.726;

9 “(f) An attorney for a defendant in a criminal proceeding, as defined in ORS 131.005, when the
10 audio or video recording could lead to the discovery of admissible evidence in the criminal pro-
11 ceeding;

12 “(g) A labor organization, as defined in ORS 663.005, for use in an action by an employer against
13 a member of the labor organization for the purpose of punishing the member;

14 “(h) A citizen review body designated by the public body, for purposes of the investigation; or

15 “(i) The Attorney General.

16 “(4) The disclosure of records under subsection (3) of this section does not make the records
17 subject to further disclosure.”.
