

# House Bill 3310

Sponsored by Representative WINGARD; Representatives KRIEGER, THOMPSON

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Specifies minimum number of instructional days that class schedule adopted by district school board must provide.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

1  
2 Relating to instructional days of a school year.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1. (1) Except as provided in subsection (2) of this section, each district school**  
5 **board shall adopt a class schedule that provides no fewer than 180 instructional days each**  
6 **school year to students who attend a school of the district.**

7 (2) **If a school district has a four-day school week, a district school board may adopt a**  
8 **class schedule that provides fewer than 180 instructional days each school year.**

9 (3) **The State Board of Education shall adopt rules that establish the standards of an in-**  
10 **structional day. Rules adopted under this subsection may require different minimum and**  
11 **maximum numbers of hours in an instructional day according to:**

12 (a) **The grade level of the student.**

13 (b) **Whether the school district has a four-day school week or a five-day school week.**

14 **SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2011 Act first applies to the 2012-2013 school year.**
