

House Bill 3437

Sponsored by Representative SHEEHAN

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Creates offense of unlawfully transferring an object on a highway. Punishes by maximum fine of \$90.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to violations.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2011 Act is added to and made a part of the Oregon Vehicle**
5 **Code.**

6 **SECTION 2. (1) A person commits the offense of unlawfully transferring an object on a**
7 **highway if:**

8 (a) **The person is a driver or a passenger in a motor vehicle that is located on a highway**
9 **and the person transfers an object to a pedestrian; or**

10 (b) **The person is a pedestrian and receives an object from a driver or a passenger in a**
11 **motor vehicle that is located on a highway.**

12 (2) **This section does not apply:**

13 (a) **If the motor vehicle is lawfully parked on the highway.**

14 (b) **To transfers of objects to or from:**

15 (A) **A police officer or fire service professional as those terms are defined in ORS 181.610,**
16 **or an emergency medical technician, as that term is defined in ORS 682.025.**

17 (B) **A toll collector, highway construction or safety worker, letter carrier or other gov-**
18 **ernmental employee acting within the scope of employment.**

19 (3) **The offense described in this section, unlawfully transferring an object on a highway,**
20 **is a Class D violation.**
