House Bill 3468

Sponsored by Representative NATHANSON

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Directs Oregon Department of Administrative Services to conduct study of public records containing personal information and exemptions from disclosure of public records containing personal information. Directs department to make specified recommendations to House and Senate Committees on Judiciary during 2012 regular session concerning management of public records containing personal information.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

Relating to management of public records containing personal information; and declaring an emergency.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. (1) The Oregon Department of Administrative Services shall study and review the public records laws and make recommendations for balancing improved and appropriate access to public records with protections for personal information contained in public records.

- (2) In performing the study and review described in subsection (1) of this section, the department shall:
- (a) Review existing exemptions from disclosure of public records that contain personal information;
- (b) Identify methods and procedures for standardizing and making consistent the information that is not disclosed on grounds of personal privacy;
- (c) Identify categories of public records that contain personal information and review the appropriateness of disclosing or treating as confidential those records;
- (d) Identify duplicative or little-used exemptions from disclosure of public records containing personal information and make recommendations on the continued need for those exemptions; and
- (e) Identify ways in which technology may be used to improve efficiency in managing public records and segregating confidential public records from disclosable public records.
- (3) The department shall report its findings to the House and Senate Committees on Judiciary during the 2012 regular session of the Legislative Assembly.

SECTION 2. This 2011 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2011 Act takes effect on its passage.
