

House Bill 3470

Sponsored by Representative NATHANSON

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Requires Director of Human Services to convene task force to recommend to Legislative Assembly improvements to delivery of highest priority human services.
Sunsets task force on date of convening of 2013 regular session.
Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

1
2 Relating to prioritization of human services programs; and declaring an emergency.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1. (1) The Director of Human Services shall convene a task force to identify**
5 **the highest priority human services administered by this state and to recommend improve-**
6 **ments to achieve the most effective and efficient delivery of the services while maximizing**
7 **resources.**

8 (2) The task force shall report to the Legislative Assembly in the manner provided by
9 ORS 192.245 no later than October 1, 2012, on the following:

10 (a) The human services identified by the task force as the highest priorities.

11 (b) Recommendations from an entrepreneurial perspective for the redesign of the deliv-
12 ery of the services, how they are regulated and how to reduce the administrative burden
13 while ensuring quality and compliance.

14 (c) Recommendations about where each component of service oversight and delivery will
15 reside, whether it is with state government, local government or nongovernmental organ-
16 izations, with the goal of maximizing the use of existing resources.

17 (d) Recommendations about how performance will be measured, outcomes assured and
18 accountability monitored through effective and efficient planning, reporting and auditing.

19 (3) A majority of the voting members of the task force constitutes a quorum for the
20 transaction of business.

21 (4) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a majority of the voting
22 members of the task force.

23 (5) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as chairperson.

24 (6) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the director shall make an appointment to become
25 immediately effective.

26 (7) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the call of the chairperson
27 or of a majority of the voting members of the task force.

28 (8) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of the task force.

29 (9) The Department of Human Services shall provide staff support to the task force and
30 shall contract with a private entity capable of assisting with baselining and benchmarking.
