House Bill 3473

Sponsored by Representative KOMP; Representative NATHANSON

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Directs Superintendent of Public Instruction to enter into contracts for purpose of making educational information systems available to school districts.

Establishes Council on Educational Information Systems within Department of Education for purpose of assisting superintendent in making educational information systems available.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Department of Education for educational informa-

tion systems.

Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2011.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

- 2 Relating to educational information systems; appropriating money; and declaring an emergency.
- 3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
 - SECTION 1. As used in sections 1 to 3 of this 2011 Act:
 - (1) "Educational information system" means an electronic information system that is:
- (a) Used to collect, store and manipulate data used in the daily operation of a school 6 district, including student records, human resource records and financial records. 7
 - (b) Made available to school districts free of charge by providers who are operating under a contract entered into with the Superintendent of Public Instruction under section 2 of this 2011 Act.
 - (2) "Provider" means a school district, an education service district, a community college, an institution of higher education or any other public education entity or combination of public education entities that provide an educational information system for use by a school district.
 - SECTION 2. The Superintendent of Public Instruction shall enter into contracts with three or fewer providers for the purpose of making educational information systems available to school districts. At least one contract entered into under this section must be with a provider that addresses the needs of remote or small school districts.
 - SECTION 3. (1) For the purpose of making educational information systems available to school districts, the Superintendent of Public Instruction shall establish the Council on Educational Information Systems within the Department of Education.
 - (2) Members of the council established by this section:
 - (a) Shall be selected by the superintendent;
- 24 (b) Must represent the Department of Education, school districts, education service dis-25 tricts and state institutions of higher education; and
 - (c) May not include persons who are employed by a provider.
 - (3) The duties of the council include:
 - (a) Seeking information from users of educational information systems regarding the

types of services users require an educational information system to provide;

- (b) Recommending for adoption by the State Board of Education standards for educational information systems;
- (c) Advising the department on the preparation and distribution of a request for proposal from providers;
- (d) Recommending a quality assurance program for educational information systems, including user satisfaction surveys;
 - (e) Recommending for adoption by the board an annual grants amount for providers;
 - (f) Recommending to the department a process for selecting providers;
- (g) Performing other duties relating to educational information systems as required by the superintendent; and
- (h) Establishing a timeline for implementation of an educational information system to allow:
- (A) A designated number of school districts to implement an educational information system related to human resource records and financial records by June 2013;
- (B) A designated number of school districts to implement an educational information system related to student records by June 2013;
- (C) All school districts that have not implemented an educational information system related to human resource records and financial records under subparagraph (A) of this paragraph to implement the system by June 2015; and
- (D) All school districts that have not implemented an educational information system related to student records under subparagraph (B) of this paragraph to implement the system by June 2016.
- <u>SECTION 4.</u> The Department of Education shall report to the 2012 regular session of the Seventy-sixth Legislative Assembly on the department's progress in making educational information systems available for school districts.
- SECTION 5. (1) There is appropriated to the Department of Education, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$6,000,000 to be used by the department for making an educational information system available.
- (2) From the amount appropriated to the department under this section, the department may retain no more than \$180,000 for the purpose of paying the expenses incurred by the department in the administration of sections 2 and 3 of this 2011 Act.
- <u>SECTION 6.</u> This 2011 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2011 Act takes effect July 1, 2011.
