House Bill 3498

Sponsored by Representative CONGER; Representatives PARRISH, WAND, Senators OLSEN, TELFER, THOMSEN

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Authorizes Oregon Liquor Control Commission and Department of State Police to enter into interagency agreement for state police force members to act as agents of commission.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

- Relating to the Department of State Police.
 - Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
 - SECTION 1. (1) The Oregon Liquor Control Commission and the Department of State Police may enter into an interagency agreement to allow state police force members to act as agents of the commission for the purpose of enforcing the Liquor Control Act and rules of the commission. The interagency agreement may authorize the state police force members to:
 - (a) Conduct administrative searches on behalf of the commission to the same extent that administrative searches may be conducted by employees of the commission; and
 - (b) Issue notices of civil violations of the Liquor Control Act or commission rules discovered during an administrative search.
 - (2) The interagency agreement may authorize a state police force member to act as an agent of the commission only if the member is present at a licensed premises for the purpose of performing duties as a state police force member.
 - (3) The existence of an interagency agreement does not limit a state police force member in carrying out any law enforcement function that may properly be performed by the state police force member.
 - (4) A state police force member who is acting as an agent of the commission under the interagency agreement is considered to be performing duties as a state police force member for purposes of wages, workers' compensation insurance, disability insurance and other work-related or private insurance, entitlements or benefits. This subsection does not prohibit an interagency agreement provision for financial reimbursement from the commission to the department.
