

House Bill 3554

Sponsored by Representative HICKS

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Eliminates inclusion of certain moneys received for purpose of paying for costs incurred in providing career and technical education from calculations made to distribute certain state funds to school districts, education service districts, community college districts and community college service districts.

Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2011.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to funding for career and technical education; and declaring an emergency.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2011 Act is added to and made a part of ORS 327.006 to 327.133.

SECTION 2. Amounts to be distributed to a school district or an education service district from the State School Fund or from any other source that is distributed by the Superintendent of Public Instruction may not be decreased by any amounts received by the district from any public or private entity for the purpose of paying for costs incurred in providing career and technical education to the students of the district.

SECTION 3. Section 4 of this 2011 Act is added to and made a part of ORS chapter 341.

SECTION 4. Amounts to be distributed to a community college district or a community college service district from the Community College Support Fund or from any other fund established by the State Board of Education may not be decreased by any amounts received by the district from any public or private entity for the purpose of paying for costs incurred in providing career and technical education to the students of the district.

SECTION 5. Sections 2 and 4 of this 2011 Act apply to distributions commencing with the 2011-2012 distributions.

SECTION 6. This 2011 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2011 Act takes effect July 1, 2011.
