4	"249.052. (1) For purposes of determining whether a candidate for the office of state
5	Representative or state Senator has been an inhabitant of the district from which the Sen-
6	ator or Representative may be chosen as required by section 8, Article IV of the Oregon
7	Constitution, an elections official may consider, but is not limited to considering, the fol-
8	lowing factors:
9	"(a) Where the candidate receives personal mail;
10	"(b) Where the candidate is licensed to drive;
11	"(c) Where the candidate registers motor vehicles for personal use;
12	"(d) Where any immediate family members of the candidate reside;
13	"(e) The address from which the candidate pays for utility services;
14	"(f) The address from which the candidate files any federal or state income tax returns;
15	and
16	"(g) The candidate's voter registration, if any.
17	"[(1)] (2)(a) If the county clerk determines that the property indicated by the address informa-
18	tion provided on a nominating petition or declaration of candidacy for nomination or election to the
19	office of state Senator or state Representative is located less than 100 radial yards from the
20	boundary of the district in which the candidate has filed for nomination or election, the Secretary
21	of State shall verify the location of the residence of the candidate to determine whether the candi-
22	date is an inhabitant of the district.
23	"[(2)] (b) The Legislative Administration Committee shall make available to the secretary any
24	mapping software and hardware used by the Legislative Assembly for redistricting to aid the sec-
25	retary in verifying a candidate's residence under this section.".
