House Bill 5020

Introduced and printed pursuant to House Rule 12.00. Presession filed (at the request of Budget and Management Division, Oregon Department of Administrative Services)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Department of Education for certain biennial expenses.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to department for distribution as grants-in-aid and to purchase services.

Limits certain biennial expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by department.

Limits biennial expenditures by department from certain federal funds.

Limits biennial expenditures by department for payment of grants-in-aid and purchased services from certain federal funds received by department.

Limits biennial expenditures by department for payment of grants-in-aid and purchased services from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by department.

Limits payment by department of expenses related to state education lottery bonds.

Authorizes specified nonlimited expenditures.

Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2011.

SECTION 3. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the following amounts are established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, as the maximum limits for payment of expenses, other than expenses described in sections 6 and 10 of this 2011 Act, from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Department of Education for the following purposes:

- 13 (1) Operations...... \$ 14,507,089
- 14 (2) Oregon School for the Deaf..... \$ 5,823,913
 - (3) Youth Corrections

16 Education Program...... \$ 9,231,781

SECTION 4. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the following amounts are established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, as the maximum limits for payment of expenses from federal funds, other than those described in sections 5 and 10 of this 2011 Act, collected or received by the Department of Education for the following purposes:

- (1) Operations...... \$ 66,478,054
- (2) Oregon School for the deaf...... \$ 316,045
- 23 (3) Youth Corrections
 - Education Program...... \$ 2,250,271

<u>SECTION 5.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$722,225,628 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, as the maximum limit for payment of grants-in-aid and purchased services from federal funds received by the Department of Education from the United States Department of Education and from other federal agencies other than the United States Department of Agriculture.

<u>SECTION</u> 6. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$15,215,588 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, as the maximum limit for payment of grants-in-aid and purchased services from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Department of Education for grant programs other than those specified in section 2 of this 2011 Act.

SECTION 7. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$48,811,585 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses by the Department of Education from lottery moneys allocated from the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund to the department for debt service on outstanding state education lottery bonds.

<u>SECTION 8.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$6,686,305 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses by the Department of Education from lottery moneys allocated from the Oregon Education Fund to the department for debt service on outstanding state education lottery bonds.

SECTION 9. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of
\$2,464,515 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, as the maximum limit for
payment of expenses by the Department of Education from Lottery Bond Fund earnings
collected or received by the department for debt service on outstanding state education lot-
tery bonds.
SECTION 10. For the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, the following expenditures by the

- Department of Education are not limited:
- (1) Moneys from the School Lunch Revolving Account, Education Training Revolving Account, Tuition Protection Fund, and Common School Fund; and
- (2) Expenditures for grants-in-aid and purchased services from federal funds received by the Department of Education from the United States Department of Agriculture.
- SECTION 11. This 2011 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2011 Act takes effect July 1, 2011.

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
