Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Department of Human Services for certain biennial

Limits biennial expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and certain federal funds, but excluding lottery funds and other federal funds, collected or received by department for certain purposes.

Limits biennial expenditures by department from certain federal funds. Authorizes specified nonlimited expenditures.

Appropriates for biennium beginning July 1, 2011, moneys from General Fund to Emergency Board to allocate to department for child welfare differential response services.

Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2011.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

- Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
- SECTION 1. There are appropriated to the Department of Human Services, for the 5 biennium beginning July 1, 2011, out of the General Fund, the following amounts, of which 6 the department may expend up to 54 percent during the period beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2012, for the following purposes:

- SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the following amounts 15

- Medicare receipts and including federal funds for indirect cost recovery, Social Security 18

16	SECTION 5. (1) In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appro-
17	priated to the Emergency Board, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, out of the General
18	Fund, the amount of \$5,000,000, to be allocated to the Department of Human Services for
19	child welfare differential response services.
20	(2) If any of the moneys appropriated by subsection (1) of this section are not allocated
21	by the Emergency Board prior to December 1, 2012, the moneys remaining on that date be-
22	come available for any purpose for which the Emergency Board lawfully may allocate funds.
23	SECTION 6. This 2011 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
24	peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2011 Act takes effect
25	July 1, 2011.

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
