Limits biennial expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by State Treasurer for administrative expenses of State Treasury operations and Oregon 529 College Savings Network.

Authorizes specified nonlimited expenditures.

Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2011.

4	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
5	SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the following amounts
6	are established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, as the maximum limits for payment
7	of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but ex-
8	cluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the State Treasurer, for the
9	following purposes:
10	(1) Administrative expenses of
11	State Treasury operations \$ 31,572,698
12	(2) Administrative expenses of
13	the Oregon 529 College
14	Savings Network \$ 3,522,192
15	SECTION 2. For the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, expenditures made by the State
16	Treasurer to pay for cash management services are not limited.
17	SECTION 3. This 2011 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
18	peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2011 Act takes effect
19	July 1, 2011.
