SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

[Limits biennial expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by _____.] [Limits biennial expenditures of ____ from federal funds.]

[Limits biennial expenditures of _____ from federal funds.] Adjusts for biennium beginning July 1, 2009, specified appropriations from General Fund to specified state agencies.

Adjusts for biennium beginning July 1, 2009, and for specified fiscal years, limitations on specified expenditures.

Appropriates for biennium beginning July 1, 2009, moneys from General Fund to specified state agencies.

Declares emergency, effective [July 1, 2011] on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to state financial administration; creating new provisions; amending sections 1, 2 and 7,

3 chapter 727, Oregon Laws 2009, and section 87, chapter 95, Oregon Laws 2010; appropriating

4 money; limiting expenditures; and declaring an emergency.

5 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

6 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-

7 ation made to the Department of Education by section 1, chapter 635, Oregon Laws 2009, for

8 the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, is increased by \$16,933,881 for the State School Fund.

9 (2) Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on expenditures

10 established by section 2, chapter 635, Oregon Laws 2009, for the biennium beginning July 1,

11 2009, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from lottery moneys allocated from the

12 Administrative Services Economic Development Fund to the Department of Education, is

13 increased by \$18,610,922 for the State School Fund.

<u>SECTION 2.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on expenditures established by section 2 (6), chapter 657, Oregon Laws 2009, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Oregon Department of Administrative Services, is increased by \$8,000,000 for prepayment of debt service.

20 <u>SECTION 3.</u> (1) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropri-21 ation made to the Judicial Department by section 1 (1), chapter 723, Oregon Laws 2009, for 22 the biennium beginning July 1, 2009, is decreased by \$12,426,997 for operations.
