House Concurrent Resolution 10

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Recognizes the 2010 University of Oregon football program.

2	Whereas the 2010 football season for the University of Oregon Ducks was one of the greatest
3	in the history of this state; and
4	Whereas the efforts of the University of Oregon football program have propelled Oregon into
5	the national limelight; and
6	Whereas the 2010 football program was the first in school history to achieve a perfect 12-0
7	regular season; and
8	Whereas the University of Oregon has been the outright PAC-10 champion in football for two
9	consecutive seasons; and
10	Whereas the University of Oregon was recognized as the nation's top ranked football team
11	during much of the 2010 season; and
12	Whereas on December 4, 2010, the Oregon Ducks beat their in-state rival in the 114th Civil War
13	game to secure their first-ever berth in the BCS National Championship Game; and
14	Whereas Oregon Coach Chip Kelly has won several national coach of the year awards in only
15	his second year as Oregon's head football coach; and
16	Whereas running back LaMichael James became Oregon's first unanimous All-American, won
17	the Doak Walker Award as the nation's top running back and finished third in the Heisman Trophy
18	balloting (the best ever by a Duck football player); and
19	Whereas Cliff Harris was also named an All-American as a punt returner; and
20	Whereas their efforts, conduct and exemplary play brought pride to all Oregonians; and
21	Whereas the Ducks will be the first team from Oregon to play for a national championship in
22	football; now, therefore,
23	Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:
24	That we, the members of the Seventy-sixth Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon, on be-
25	half of all Oregonians, recognize, honor and celebrate the achievements of the University of Oregon
26	football program during the 2010 regular season and the Ducks' playing in the BCS National
27	Championship Game on January 10, 2011; and be it further
28	Resolved, That a copy of this resolution shall be presented to the team as an expression of our
29	esteem, admiration and continued best wishes for success.
