## **House Concurrent Resolution 13**

Sponsored by Representative MCLANE, Senator WHITSETT

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Whereas settlers to the Rogue Valley started a community on the banks of the Little Butte

3	Creek in the 1850s, along the military road from Jacksonville to Fort Klamath; and
4	Whereas in 1872 the Snowy Butte Mill was built, which further developed the growing
5	settlement's reputation as the "Food Basket" for Jacksonville and Medford; and
6	Whereas the community's development through the first fifty years of settlement caused com-
7	munity leaders to incorporate the City of Eagle Point in 1911; and
8	Whereas the city is named for the bald eagle population that inhabited the surrounding hills;

10	Whereas Eagle Point continues to be a rich agricultural community that includes the continuing
11	operation of the Snowy Butte Mill, now the Butte Creek Mill, which is the oldest hydropower
12	gristmill west of the Mississippi River; and
13	Whereas Eagle Point has a strong tradition of supporting the nation's defense, including seeing
14	its citizens serve in World War I, World War II, the Korean Conflict, the Vietnam War, the Persian
15	Gulf War and the current engagements in Iraq and Afghanistan; and
16	Whereas for its strong support of the military, including the support of the World War II
17	training facility, Camp White, located just outside of the city, Eagle Point has one of only three
18	National Cemeteries in Oregon; and
19	Whereas Eagle Point has seen a dramatic population growth in recent years, doubling to nearly

9,000 in ten years' time, most of which is due to the development of one of Oregon's highest-rated

Whereas Eagle Point continues to be a strong, supportive community powered by its citizens;

That we, the members of the Seventy-sixth Legislative Assembly, commemorate the City of Eagle

Point on its 100th anniversary and convey our warmest regards to its residents.
