**House Concurrent Resolution 27**

Whereas Oregon State Police Senior Trooper Maria F. Mignano was born May 10, 1962, to Anthony and Rose Mignano, in Long Beach, California; and

Whereas in 1980 Senior Trooper Mignano graduated from San Pedro High School and then attended Los Angeles Harbor College, where she studied to be an emergency medical technician; and

Whereas in 1984 Senior Trooper Mignano was employed by Salem Hospital, where she worked as an emergency room admissions clerk; and

Whereas in June 1993 Senior Trooper Mignano entered the Oregon State Police Recruit School and, upon graduation, was assigned to the Salem office, where she served for eight years; and

Whereas Senior Trooper Mignano served on the Mobile Response Team, earned an Officer of the Year Award and was certified as a Drug Recognition Expert; and

Whereas Senior Trooper Mignano was a hard worker and very passionate about her faith, flamenco dancing, the Spanish language and international travel; and

Whereas Senior Trooper Mignano was skilled in martial arts and loved to go sailing with her family; and

Whereas Senior Trooper Mignano was killed in the line of duty on September 4, 2001, when she and Albany Police Officer Jason Hoerauf were struck and instantly killed by a driver of a vehicle as the officers were assisting a family with a disabled van along Interstate 5 near the Ankeny Hill exit; and

Whereas Senior Trooper Mignano is survived by her identical twin sister, Theresa, her mother and her other siblings; now, therefore,

**Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:**

That we, the members of the Seventy-sixth Legislative Assembly, recognize and honor Senior Trooper Maria F. Mignano for her service to this state.
