House Concurrent Resolution 8

Urges support for Statewide Food Systems Council.

2	Whereas hunger is a statewide problem in Oregon; and
3	Whereas the Statewide Food Systems Council plans to examine the future of rural grocery
4	stores, the need for mobile food processing operations throughout Oregon, the opportunities for
5	farm-to-institution expansion and the local barriers to food systems successes, and plans to identify
6	solutions and best practices to share statewide; and
7	Whereas the Statewide Food Systems Council will be funded by a United States Department of
8	Agriculture grant; and
9	Whereas Partners for a Hunger-Free Oregon will provide staff for the Statewide Food Systems
10	Council; and
11	Whereas appropriate state agencies are strongly encouraged to participate in the Statewide
12	Food Systems Council; and
13	Whereas the Statewide Food Systems Council needs participation from legislative, governmental
14	and nonprofit organizations and citizen partners from various food sectors, including food consump-
15	tion, distribution, production, processing and waste management; now, therefore,
16	Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:
17	That we, the members of the Seventy-sixth Legislative Assembly, express our support for the
18	efforts of the Statewide Food Systems Council to alleviate hunger in Oregon; and be it further
19	Resolved, That the Legislative Assembly requests that the Statewide Food Systems Council
20	provide a report on food processing barriers and potential solutions to the Legislative Assembly in
21	2013.
