House Joint Memorial 21

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Urges United States Department of Labor to review H-2B visa program certification process.

1	JOINT MEMORIAL
2	To the President of the United States and the United States Secretary of Labor:
3	We, your memorialists, the Seventy-sixth Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon, in legis-
4	lative session assembled, respectfully represent as follows:
5	Whereas the federal government owns 18.2 million acres of Oregon's 30 million acres of
6	forestland; and
7	Whereas a recent study shows that many of the federally owned forests in Oregon are over-
8	crowded and subject to devastating fires and insect infestations; and
9	Whereas management of these federally owned forests in Oregon is an ongoing process that in-
10	volves a large workforce; and
11	Whereas the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 allows the United States De-
12	partment of Labor to award contracts to companies under the H-2B visa program to use foreign la-
13	bor on forestry jobs, even though the Act was largely intended to provide a short-term boost in
14	United States employment; and
15	Whereas the United States Department of Labor has sole responsibility for oversight of H-2B
16	visa workers; and
17	Whereas almost \$13 million in United States Forest Service contracts has been awarded to
18	Oregon companies that use seasonal foreign workers under the H-2B visa program; and
19	Whereas Oregon's unemployment rate hovers around 10 percent, and the rate in some counties
20	in central and eastern Oregon is much higher; and
21	Whereas under the H-2B visa program, contractors "self-attest" without providing documenta-
22	tion that they are unable to find local workers who are willing to work or are qualified for jobs;
23	and
24	Whereas because there is such a high unemployment rate in Oregon, it is difficult to believe that
25	companies are unable to find Oregon workers who are willing and able to work in the forests and
26	must give the jobs to foreign workers instead; and
27	Whereas contracts for forestry jobs have been awarded to contractors that may not have com-
28	plied with the intent of the federal regulations and may have illegally acquired H-2B foreign worker
29	visa permits from the United States Department of Labor; now, therefore,
30	Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:
31	That we, the members of the Seventy-sixth Legislative Assembly, urge the United States De-
32	partment of Labor to ensure that no federal stimulus funds for federal forest management contracts

- 3 Resolved, That a copy of this memorial shall be sent to the President of the United States, to
- 4 the United States Secretary of Labor and to each member of the Oregon Congressional Delegation.
