SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

JOINT MEMORIAL

Urges Congress to fund mobile health care buses for women veterans.

2	To the President of the United States and the Senate and the House of Representatives of the United
3	States of America, in Congress assembled:
4	We, your memorialists, the Seventy-sixth Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon, in legis-
5	lative session assembled, respectfully represent as follows:
6	Whereas the United States Department of Veterans Affairs Veterans Health Administration is
7	charged with providing health care, including mental health care, to all eligible veterans, including
8	women veterans; and
9	Whereas 25,000 women veterans from all eras of service reside in Oregon; and
10	Whereas more than 240,000 women veterans have served in Operation Enduring Freedom and
11	Operation Iraqi Freedom; and
12	Whereas the Veterans Health Administration health care system presents barriers to women's
13	health care; and
14	Whereas many Oregon women veterans live in rural and remote parts of this state without
15	reasonable access to Veterans Health Administration health care; and
16	Whereas no woman veteran should have to forgo the veteran's earned medical benefits because
17	of physical or emotional barriers; now, therefore,
18	Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:
19	(1) The Seventy-sixth Legislative Assembly urges the Congress of the United States of America
20	to fund mobile health care buses for women veterans, staffed with trained physical and mental
21	health professionals from the Veterans Health Administration, that will travel throughout this state
22	providing health care to women veterans in their communities.
23	(2) A copy of this memorial shall be sent to the President of the United States, to the Senate
24	Majority Leader, to the Speaker of the House of Representatives and to each member of the Oregon
25	Congressional Delegation.
