## **House Memorial 3**

Sponsored by Representative HICKS

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Urges Congress to repeal federal No Child Left Behind Act.

2	To the President of the United States and the Senate and the House of Representatives of the United
3	States of America, in Congress assembled:
4	We, your memorialists, the House of Representatives of the State of Oregon, in legislative ses
5	sion assembled, respectfully represent as follows:
6	Whereas putting our children first is both an economic imperative and a moral necessity; and
7	Whereas a strong education system is vital to a strong economy; and
8	Whereas the federal No Child Left Behind Act is insufficiently funded to bring about its in
9	tended effect; and
10	Whereas the federal No Child Left Behind Act has imposed what in effect is an unfunded edu
11	cational mandate on the states; and
12	Whereas the ongoing recession has forced the State of Oregon to make difficult decisions re
13	garding the funding of public education; and
14	Whereas these decisions have resulted in larger class sizes, layoffs of educational staff, curtail
15	ment of extracurricular activities and school sponsored programs and a shorter school year; and
16	Whereas Oregon is losing teachers to states in which school budgets are more stable; and
17	Whereas economic recovery and development depend upon an educated workforce that possesses
18	the skills that are necessary to handle the jobs of the 21st century; and
19	Whereas the State of Oregon cannot achieve and maintain prosperity if it does not properly fund
20	secondary and post-secondary education; and
21	Whereas Republicans and Democrats agree that burdensome regulations prevent our schools
22	our teachers and our students from achieving their potential; now, therefore,
23	Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Oregon:
24	(1) The Congress of the United States of America is respectfully urged to repeal the No Child
25	Left Behind Act of 2001 (P.L. 107-110, 115 Stat. 1425).
26	(2) A copy of this memorial shall be sent to the President of the United States and to each
27	member of the Oregon Congressional Delegation.
