House Memorial 6

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Urges President and Congress of United States to revisit and comprehensively review Bayh-Dole Act to resolve significant issues regarding university creation of intellectual property rights with federal funding.

4 We, your memorialists, the House of Representatives of the State of Oregon, in legislative ses-

5 sion assembled, respectfully represent as follows:

6 Whereas P.L. 96-517, Patent and Trademark Act Amendments of 1980, commonly known as the 7 Bayh-Dole Act, has been law for more than 30 years; and

8 Whereas numerous issues have arisen with the provisions of the Bayh-Dole Act and its impact 9 on the use of intellectual property acquired or developed by universities in this state and in other 10 states of the United States; now, therefore,

11 Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Oregon:

(1) The House of Representatives of the Seventy-sixth Legislative Assembly of the State of
Oregon urges the President and the Congress of the United States to revisit and comprehensively
review the Bayh-Dole Act, concentrating on the following issues:

(a) The need for a practical research exemption to permit the ongoing use of technologies de-veloped with public funds for noncommercial research;

17 (b) The lack of a systemic approach to provide broad access to publicly funded research tools;

(c) The need for reform to address the negative effects that result from fragmented ownershipof publicly funded research inventions; and

20 (d) Access to patented, publicly funded technologies for humanitarian purposes.

(2) A copy of this memorial shall be sent to the President of the United States, to the Senate
Majority Leader, to the Speaker of the House of Representatives and to each member of the Oregon
Congressional Delegation.
