Senate Bill 102

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SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Requires Oregon Health Authority to report to Seventy-seventh Legislative Assembly on changes necessary to implement federal health care law.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

5	SECTION 1. The Oregon Health Authority shall review the state statutes administered

7	to the statutes that are necessary to implement the requirements of and the state options
8	available under the federal Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (P.L. 111-148), as
9	amended by the Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act of 2010 (P.L. 111-152).
