

# Senate Bill 105

Printed pursuant to Senate Interim Rule 213.28 by order of the President of the Senate in conformance with pre-session filing rules, indicating neither advocacy nor opposition on the part of the President (at the request of Governor John A. Kitzhaber for Oregon Health Authority)

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Requires Oregon Department of Administrative Services to transfer certain amounts from Tobacco Settlement Funds Account for certain purposes.

Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2011.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to financial administration of the Tobacco Settlement Funds Account; and declaring an emergency.

**Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

**SECTION 1. In addition to transfers to the Tobacco Enforcement Fund under ORS 293.537, the Oregon Department of Administrative Services shall make the following transfers from the Tobacco Settlement Funds Account for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011:**

(1) **To the Oregon Appropriation Bond Fund established under section 3, chapter 11, Oregon Laws 2003 ..... \$140,000,000**

(2) **To the Oregon Health and Science University Bond Fund established under section 14, chapter 921, Oregon Laws 2001 ..... \$ 32,000,000**

(3) **To the Tobacco Use Reduction Account established under ORS 431.832 ..... \$ 20,000,000**

(4) **To the Oregon Health Authority for expenses of the Oregon Health Plan ..... \$ 20,000,000**

**SECTION 2. This 2011 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2011 Act takes effect July 1, 2011.**
