SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Modifies offense of making illegal U-turn.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to U-turns; creating new provisions; and amending ORS 811.365.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 **SECTION 1.** ORS 811.365 is amended to read:

5 811.365. (1) A person commits the offense of making an illegal U-turn if the person is operating

6 a vehicle and the person turns the vehicle so as to proceed in the opposite direction in any of the

7 following places:

8 (a) Within an intersection where [*traffic is controlled by an electrical signal. This paragraph does*

9 not apply where posted otherwise.] a sign prohibits U-turns.

10 (b) Upon a highway within the limits of an incorporated city between intersections.

11 (c) At any place upon a highway where the vehicle cannot be seen by another driver ap-12 proaching from either direction within a distance of:

13 (A) 500 feet within the incorporated limits of a city; or

14 (B) 1,000 feet outside a city.

15 (d) In any location where a U-turn cannot be made safely or where a U-turn would in-16 terfere with other traffic or pedestrians.

17 (2) The offense described in this section, illegal U-turn, is a Class C traffic violation unless 18 commission of the offense contributes to an accident. If commission of the offense contributes to an 19 accident, the offense is a Class B traffic violation.

20 <u>SECTION 2.</u> The amendments to ORS 811.365 by section 1 of this 2011 Act apply to of-21 fenses committed on or after the effective date of this 2011 Act.
