SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Exempts person applying for restricted motorcycle endorsement to operate motorcycle with more than two wheels from requirement to take motorcycle rider education course.

Requires Department of Transportation to submit report on operation of three-wheeled motor vehicles on public highways to legislative or interim legislative committees related to transportation within 60 days of receiving report from American Association of Motor Vehicle Administrators.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to motorcycle endorsements; creating new provisions; and amending ORS 807.175.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1.** ORS 807.175 is amended to read:

5 807.175. (1) The Department of Transportation may not issue a motorcycle endorsement to a
6 person unless the person shows to the satisfaction of the department that the person has success-
7 fully completed a motorcycle rider education course established by the department under ORS
8 802.320. This requirement is in addition to any other requirement for the endorsement.

9 (2) Subsection (1) of this section does not apply to a person applying for issuance of a motor-
10 cycle endorsement under ORS 807.170 who:

11 (a) Currently holds a motorcycle endorsement issued by another state; **or**

12 (b) **Is applying for a restricted motorcycle endorsement that only authorizes the person**
13 **to operate a motorcycle with more than two wheels.**

14 **SECTION 2.** Within 60 days after receiving a report published by the American Associ-
15 ation of Motor Vehicle Administrators on issues related to three-wheeled motor vehicles
16 operating on public highways, including but not limited to motorcycle endorsements, the
17 Department of Transportation shall submit the report and a summary of the report to the
18 legislative committees related to transportation during a session of the Legislative Assembly
19 or, if the Legislative Assembly is not in session, to the interim legislative committees related
20 to transportation.

21 **SECTION 3.** The amendments to ORS 807.175 by section 1 of this 2011 Act apply to per-
22 sons applying for a motorcycle endorsement on or after the effective date of this 2011 Act.
