## Senate Bill 135

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## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Modifies membership of State Mortuary and Cemetery Board. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to appointment of members to the State Mortuary and Cemetery Board; creating new pro-

visions; amending ORS 692.300; and declaring an emergency.

4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

5 **SECTION 1.** ORS 692.300 is amended to read:

6 692.300. (1) There is created the State Mortuary and Cemetery Board to carry out the purposes 7 and enforce the provisions of this chapter. The board consists of **up to** 11 members appointed by the 8 Governor and subject to confirmation by the Senate in the manner provided in ORS 171.562 and

9 171.565. All members of the board must be residents of this state. Of the members of the board:

- 10 (a) [Two] Three members must be [licensed funeral service practitioners. One of the members un-
- 11 der this paragraph must be a funeral service practitioner who does not offer embalming] individuals

## 12 licensed by the board.

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13 [(b) One member must be a licensed embalmer.]

14 [(c)] (b) Three members must be representatives of cemeteries, one representing for-profit or 15 **nonprofit** cemeteries, one representing a city or county owned or operated cemetery and one rep-16 resenting a special district owned or operated cemetery.

[(d)] (c) One member must be a representative of a [crematorium] facility, other than a cem etery, used for final disposition of human remains.

19 [(e)] (d) Four members must be representatives of the public who are not licensed by the 20 board, one of whom must be a member of a recognized senior citizen organization.

(2) The Governor may appoint a single board member to fill more than one of the cate gories of representation required by subsection (1)(a) to (c) of this section.

[(2)(a)] (3)(a) Board members required to be licensed [funeral service practitioners or licensed
embalmers] by the board or representatives of facilities licensed by the board may be selected
by the Governor from a list of three to five nominees for each vacancy, submitted by[:]

[(A)] individuals or facilities licensed by the board or any professional organization representing individuals or facilities licensed by the board. [funeral service practitioners, if the vacancy on the board is for a funeral service practitioner position; or]

29 [(B) Any professional organization representing embalmers, if the vacancy on the board is for an 30 embalmer position.] 1 (b) In selecting the members of the board, the Governor shall strive to balance the represen-2 tation on the board according to:

3 (A) Geographic areas of this state; and

4 (B) Ethnic group.

5  $[(3)(\alpha)]$  (4)(a) The term of office of the members of the board shall be three years ending on 6 December 31, but a member serves at the pleasure of the Governor. The terms must be staggered 7 so that no more than four terms end each year. A member is eligible for no more than two consec-8 utive terms. If there is a vacancy for any cause, the Governor shall make an appointment to become 9 immediately effective for the unexpired term.

(b) A board member shall be removed immediately from the board if, during the member's term,the member:

12 (A) Is not a resident of this state;

(B) Has been absent from three consecutive board meetings, unless at least one absence is ex cused; or

15 (C) Is not [a licensed funeral service practitioner or a retired funeral service practitioner] an in-16 dividual licensed by the board or a retired individual whose license was in good standing at the 17 time of retirement, if the board member was appointed to serve on the board as an individual li-18 censed by the board. [a funeral service practitioner; or]

19 [(D) Is not a licensed embalmer or a retired embalmer whose license was in good standing at the 20 time of retirement, if the board member was appointed to serve on the board as an embalmer.]

21 <u>SECTION 2.</u> (1) The amendments to ORS 692.300 by section 1 of this 2011 Act apply to 22 appointments to the State Mortuary and Cemetery Board made on or after the effective date 23 of this 2011 Act.

(2) A member serving on the board on the effective date of this 2011 Act continues to
 serve until the term of office for which the member was appointed terminates by expiration
 of time, resignation from the board by the member or removal of the member from office.

27 <u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2011 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 28 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2011 Act takes effect 29 on its passage.

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
