## Senate Bill 203

Sponsored by Senator BATES (Presession filed.)

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Requires physician to practice medicine without interference or influence by persons not licensed to practice medicine.

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2 Relating to the practice of medicine.

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- 3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
  - SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2011 Act is added to and made a part of ORS chapter 677.
- 5 <u>SECTION 2.</u> (1) Only a person licensed as a physician by the Oregon Medical Board may conduct or maintain a medical practice in this state.
  - (2) For the purpose of conducting or maintaining a medical practice under subsection (1) of this section, a physician must have the responsibility, without interference or influence by persons who are not licensed to practice medicine, for:
    - (a) The diagnosis of conditions affecting the human body.
    - (b) Prescribing drugs that are administered to patients in the practice of medicine.
    - (c) The treatment plan of any patient.
  - (d) The overall quality of patient care that is rendered or performed in the practice of medicine.
  - (e) Supervision of personnel involved in direct patient care and the authorization for procedures performed by them in accordance with the standards of supervision established by statute or by the rules of the board.
    - (f) Other specific services within the scope of medical practice.
  - (3) Subsections (1) and (2) of this section do not apply to a physician with a limited license issued by the board pursuant to ORS 677.132 who renders services authorized by the limited license.
    - (4) Nothing in this chapter precludes a person or entity not licensed by the board from:
  - (a) Ownership or leasehold of any tangible or intangible assets used in a medical office or clinic.
  - (b) Employing or contracting for the services of personnel other than licensed physicians or other health care professionals.
  - (c) Management of the business aspects of a medical office or clinic that do not include the practice of medicine.

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
