SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

[Expands post-secondary institution tuition waiver for children, spouses and unremarried surviving spouses of deceased or disabled veterans to include community college students.] Establishes Task Force on Tuition Waivers for Veterans at Community Colleges in

Establishes Task Force on Tuition Waivers for Veterans at Community Colleges in Oregon for purposes related to issuance of tuition waivers for veterans and their families at community college districts.

Sunsets on date of convening of 2012 regular session of Legislative Assembly. Declares emergency, effective [July 1, 2011] on passage.

1	A BILL FOR AN ACT
2	Relating to tuition waivers; and declaring an emergency.
3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. (1) The Task Force on Tuition Waivers for Veterans at Community Colleges
5	in Oregon is established, consisting of the 17 community college district presidents in this
6	state. A community college district president may designate an alternate member to repre-
7	sent the community college district.
8	(2) The task force shall address the issue of tuition waivers for veterans and their fami-
9	lies at community college districts in this state by:
10	(a) Determining a common set of policies for all community college districts in this state
11	that is in alignment with the tuition waiver provisions of ORS 351.656; and
12	(b) Comparing policies of community college districts in this state with the tuition waiver
13	policies for veterans and their families adopted by the Oregon University System, and align-
14	ing the community college district policies with those of the Oregon University System.
15	(3) A majority of the voting members of the task force constitutes a quorum for the
16	transaction of business.
17	(4) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a majority of the voting
18	members of the task force.
19	(5) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as chairperson.
20	(6) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the call of the chairperson
21	or of a majority of the voting members of the task force.
22	(7) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of the task force.
23	(8) The task force shall submit a report, and may include recommendations for legis-
24	lation, to the Legislative Assembly no later than the date of the convening of the regular

25 session of the 2012 Legislative Assembly as specified in ORS 171.010.

1 (9) The Department of Community Colleges and Workforce Development shall provide 2 staff support to the task force.

3 (10) Members of the task force are not entitled to compensation.

4 (11) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are directed to assist 5 the task force in the performance of its duties and, to the extent permitted by laws relating 6 to confidentiality, to furnish such information and advice as the members of the task force 7 consider necessary to perform their duties.

8 <u>SECTION 2.</u> Section 1 of this 2011 Act is repealed on the date of the convening of the 2012 9 regular session of the Legislative Assembly as specified in ORS 171.010.

10 <u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2011 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 11 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2011 Act takes effect 12 on its passage.

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
