A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to driving while under the influence of intoxicants; amending ORS 813.012; declaring an

emergency; and providing for criminal sentence reduction that requires approval by a two-thirds
majority.

5 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

6 **SECTION 1.** ORS 813.012 is amended to read:

7 813.012. (1) The Oregon Criminal Justice Commission shall classify [a violation of ORS 813.010

9 der the circumstances described in ORS 813.010 (5) as crime category 6 of the rules of the

10 Oregon Criminal Justice Commission.

(2) In determining criminal history for a person convicted of a felony that has operation of a
motor vehicle as an element, or of a felony that involved death, injury or property damage caused
by the use of a motor vehicle, the commission shall:

(a) Consider two prior convictions of misdemeanor driving while under the influence of
intoxicants to be equivalent to one conviction of felony driving while under the influence of
intoxicants; and

(b) Consider felony driving while under the influence of intoxicants to be a person felony and consider misdemeanor driving while under the influence of intoxicants to be a person Class A misdemeanor.

20 <u>SECTION 2.</u> This 2011 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 21 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2011 Act takes effect 22 on its passage.
