SENATE AMENDMENTS TO A-ENGROSSED SENATE BILL 395

1	On page 1 of the printed A-engrossed bill, line 3, delete "appropriating money;".
2	On page 2, delete lines 9 through 23 and insert:
3	"SECTION 3. (1) The Legislative Assembly finds and declares that:
4	"(a) In November of 2010, the voters enacted section 3, chapter 1, Oregon Laws 2011
5	which directed the state to fully reimburse counties for the costs of incarcerating person
6	sentenced under section 3, chapter 1, Oregon Laws 2011, including the costs of pretria
7	incarceration.
8	"(b) Different counties incur different costs of incarceration and many counties incu
9	different costs for different inmates within the same facility.
10	"(c) The Legislative Assembly intends to honor the direction given by the voters while
11	also creating an efficient and effective means by which to do so.
12	"(d) Counties and the Department of Corrections have previously agreed that the calcu
13	lated rate at which the department provides moneys to counties under ORS 423.530 for per
14	sons sentenced to 12 months or less incarceration is an efficient and effective means by
15	which to reimburse counties for the costs of their incarceration.
16	"(2) The department shall reimburse counties for the costs of incarcerating person
17	sentenced under section 3, chapter 1, Oregon Laws 2011, including the costs of pretria
18	incarceration.
19	"(3) The department shall adopt rules prescribing the manner in which a county may
20	submit a claim for reimbursement under this section. The reimbursement shall be calculated
21	using the rate at which the department provides moneys to counties under ORS 423.530 for
22	persons sentenced to 12 months or less incarceration.
23	"(4) Reimbursements made to counties under this section must be made from money
24	appropriated to the department for that purpose.
25	"SECTION 4. This 2011 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
26	peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2011 Act takes effect

on its passage.".
