Senate Bill 463

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Allows operators of motorcycles or mopeds to pass vehicles in same lane during traffic slow-downs. Allows operators of motorcycles or mopeds to travel between lanes of traffic or between adjacent lines or rows of vehicles during traffic slowdowns.

1 A BILL FOR AN ACT

- 2 Relating to unlawful passing; creating new provisions; and amending ORS 814.240.
 - Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
- **SECTION 1.** ORS 814.240 is amended to read:
 - 814.240. (1) A motorcycle operator or moped operator commits the offense of motorcycle or moped unlawful passing in a lane with a vehicle if the operator does any of the following:
 - (a) Overtakes and passes in the same lane occupied by the vehicle the operator is overtaking, unless the vehicle being passed is a motorcycle or a moped.
 - (b) Operates a moped or motorcycle between lanes of traffic or between adjacent lines or rows of vehicles.
 - (2) Notwithstanding subsection (1) of this section, when traffic is stopped or has slowed to a speed of less than 10 miles per hour, a motorcycle operator or moped operator may:
 - (a) Overtake and pass in the same lane occupied by the vehicle the operator is overtaking.
 - (b) Operate a motorcycle or moped between lanes of traffic or between adjacent lines or rows of vehicles.
 - (3) A motorcycle operator or moped operator proceeding as described in subsection (2) of this section may not exceed a speed of 20 miles per hour.
 - [(2)] (4) This section does not apply to a police officer in the performance of official duties.
 - [(3)] (5) The offense described in this section, motorcycle or moped unlawful passing in a lane with a vehicle, is a Class B traffic violation.
 - <u>SECTION 2.</u> The amendments to ORS 814.240 by section 1 of this 2011 Act apply to offenses committed on or after the effective date of this 2011 Act.
