## Senate Bill 480

Sponsored by Senator BONAMICI (Presession filed.)

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Specifies requirements for training provided by Department of Education related to United States Department of Agriculture's Afterschool Meal and Snack Program. Allows Department of Education to award grants related to program.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Department of Education for grants and administration of grant program.

Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2011.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT 1 Relating to the United States Department of Agriculture's Afterschool Meal and Snack Program; 2 appropriating money; and declaring an emergency. 3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: 4 5 SECTION 1. (1) The Department of Education shall provide assistance to school districts, government agencies and community groups to encourage participation in the United States 6 7 Department of Agriculture's Afterschool Meal and Snack Program. Assistance must include 8 the provision of training that is easily accessible to all regions of this state and may include 9 web-based training. (2) In addition to the assistance provided under subsection (1) of this section, the de-10 partment may award grants to school districts, government agencies and community groups 11 12 to enable participation in the United States Department of Agriculture's Afterschool Meal and Snack Program. Each grant may not exceed \$10,000 and must be used to: 13 (a) Purchase necessary equipment and services required to provide food service and meet 14 15sanitation requirements; (b) Make any payment necessary to comply with sanitation requirements that may be 16 required prior to approval; and 17(c) Fund participant outreach activities and materials. 18 19 SECTION 2. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropriated to the Department of Education, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, out of the 20 21General Fund, the amounts of: 22(1) \$175,000 for the purpose of providing grants to school districts, government agencies and community groups as described in section 1 of this 2011 Act; and 2324 (2) \$75,000 for the administration of the grant program described in section 1 of this 2011 Act. 25SECTION 3. This 2011 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 26 27peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2011 Act takes effect July 1, 2011. 28 29
