

SENATE AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 491

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after the semicolon delete the rest of the line and insert
2 “creating new provisions; amending ORS 86.745, 86.755, 90.300, 105.124 and 105.126; and declaring
3 an emergency.”.

4 Delete lines 4 through 31 and delete pages 2 through 12 and insert:

5 “**SECTION 1.** ORS 86.745, as amended by sections 1 and 2, chapter 28, Oregon Laws 2010, is
6 amended to read:

7 “86.745. The notice of sale shall:

8 “(1) List the names of the grantor, trustee and beneficiary in the trust deed, and the mailing
9 address of the trustee.

10 “(2) Describe the property the trust deed covers.

11 “(3) Identify the book and page of the mortgage records that record the trust deed.

12 “(4) State the default for which the foreclosure is made.

13 “(5) State the sum owing on the obligation that the trust deed secures.

14 “(6) State that the property will be sold to satisfy the obligation.

15 “(7) Set forth the date, time and place of the sale.

16 “(8) State that the right exists under ORS 86.753 to have the proceeding dismissed and the trust
17 deed reinstated by paying the entire amount then due, together with costs, trustee’s fees and attor-
18 ney fees, and by curing any other default complained of in the notice of default, at any time that is
19 not later than five days before the date last set for the sale.

20 “(9) If the property includes one or more dwelling units[, *as defined in ORS 90.100*] **that are**
21 **subject to ORS chapter 90**, include a notice addressed clearly to any [*person*] **individual** who oc-
22 cupies the property and who is or might be a residential tenant. The notice required under this
23 subsection must:

24 “(a) Include contact information for the Oregon State Bar and a person or organization that
25 provides legal help to individuals at no charge to the individual;

26 “(b) Include information concerning the right the [*person*] **individual** has to notice under ORS
27 86.755 **(6)(c)** [*(5)(c)*] and state that the person may have additional rights under federal law];

28 “(c) Be set apart from other text in the notice of sale; and

29 “(d) Be in substantially the following form:

33 *The property in which you are living is in foreclosure. A foreclosure sale is scheduled for*
34 _____ *Unless the lender who is foreclosing on this property is paid, the foreclosure*
35 *will go through and someone new will own this property.*

1 want to subtract the amount of your security deposit or prepaid rent from your rent payment. You may
2 do this only for the rent you owe your current landlord. If you do this, you must do so before the
3 foreclosure sale. The business or individual who buys this property at the foreclosure sale is not re-
4 sponsible to you for any deposit or prepaid rent you paid to your landlord.

5 **ABOUT YOUR TENANCY**

6 **AFTER THE FORECLOSURE SALE**

7 *The business or individual who buys this property at the foreclosure sale may be willing to allow*
8 *you to stay as a tenant instead of requiring you to move out. You should contact the buyer to discuss*
9 *that possibility if you would like to stay. Under state law, if the buyer accepts rent from you, signs a*
10 *new residential rental agreement with you or does not notify you in writing within 30 days after the*
11 *date of the foreclosure sale that you must move out, the buyer becomes your new landlord and must*
12 *maintain the property. Otherwise, the buyer is not your landlord and is not responsible for maintaining*
13 *the property on your behalf and you must move out by the date the buyer specifies in a notice to you.*

14 **YOU SHOULD CONTINUE TO PAY RENT TO YOUR LANDLORD UNTIL THE PROPERTY**
15 **IS SOLD TO ANOTHER BUSINESS OR INDIVIDUAL OR UNTIL A COURT OR A LENDER**
16 **TELLS YOU OTHERWISE. IF YOU DO NOT PAY RENT, YOU CAN BE EVICTED. AS EX-**
17 **PLAINED ABOVE, YOU MAY BE ABLE TO APPLY A DEPOSIT YOU MADE OR PREPAID**
18 **RENT YOU PAID AGAINST YOUR CURRENT RENT OBLIGATION. BE SURE TO KEEP**
19 **PROOF OF ANY PAYMENTS YOU MAKE AND OF ANY NOTICE YOU GIVE OR RECEIVE**
20 **CONCERNING THE APPLICATION OF YOUR DEPOSIT OR YOUR PREPAID RENT.**

21 **IT IS UNLAWFUL FOR ANY PERSON TO TRY TO FORCE YOU TO LEAVE YOUR HOME**
22 **WITHOUT FIRST GOING TO COURT TO EVICT YOU. FOR MORE INFORMATION ABOUT**
23 **YOUR RIGHTS, YOU MAY WISH TO CONSULT A LAWYER.** *If you believe you need legal as-*
24 *istance, contact the Oregon State Bar and ask for the lawyer referral service. Contact information for*
25 *the Oregon State Bar is included with this notice. If you do not have enough money to pay a lawyer*
26 *and are otherwise eligible, you may be able to receive legal assistance for free. Information about whom*
27 *to contact for free legal assistance is included with this notice.*

32 **NOTICE TO RESIDENTIAL TENANTS**

33 **The property in which you are living is in foreclosure. A foreclosure sale is scheduled for**
34 **_____ (date). The date of this sale may be postponed. Unless the lender that is foreclosing**
35 **on this property is paid before the sale date, the foreclosure will go through and someone**
36 **new will own this property. After the sale, the new owner is required to provide you with**
37 **contact information and notice that the sale took place.**

38 **The following information applies to you only if you are a bona fide tenant occupying and**
39 **renting this property as a residential dwelling under a legitimate rental agreement. The in-**
40 **formation does not apply to you if you own this property or if you are not a bona fide resi-**
41 **dential tenant.**

42 **If the foreclosure sale goes through, the new owner will have the right to require you**
43 **to move out. Before the new owner can require you to move, the new owner must provide**
44 **you with written notice that specifies the date by which you must move out. If you do not**
45 **leave before the move-out date, the new owner can have the sheriff remove you from the**

1 property after a court hearing. You will receive notice of the court hearing.

2 **PROTECTION FROM EVICTION**

3 **IF YOU ARE A BONA FIDE TENANT OCCUPYING AND RENTING THIS PROPERTY**
4 **AS A RESIDENTIAL DWELLING, YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO CONTINUE LIVING IN THIS**
5 **PROPERTY AFTER THE FORECLOSURE SALE FOR:**

- 6 • **THE REMAINDER OF YOUR FIXED TERM LEASE, IF YOU HAVE A FIXED TERM**
7 **LEASE; OR**
- 8 • **AT LEAST 90 DAYS FROM THE DATE YOU ARE GIVEN A WRITTEN TERMINATION**
9 **NOTICE.**

10 **If the new owner wants to move in and use this property as a primary residence, the new**
11 **owner can give you written notice and require you to move out after 90 days, even though**
12 **you have a fixed term lease with more than 90 days left.**

13 **You must be provided with at least 90 days' written notice after the foreclosure sale be-**
14 **fore you can be required to move.**

15 **A bona fide tenant is a residential tenant who is not the borrower (property owner) or**
16 **a child, spouse or parent of the borrower, and whose rental agreement:**

- 17 • **Is the result of an arm's-length transaction;**
- 18 • **Requires the payment of rent that is not substantially less than fair market rent for**
19 **the property, unless the rent is reduced or subsidized due to a federal, state or local subsidy;**
20 **and**
- 21 • **Was entered into prior to the date of the foreclosure sale.**

22 **ABOUT YOUR TENANCY**
23 **BETWEEN NOW AND THE FORECLOSURE SALE:**

24 **RENT**

25 **YOU SHOULD CONTINUE TO PAY RENT TO YOUR LANDLORD UNTIL THE PROP-**
26 **ERTY IS SOLD OR UNTIL A COURT TELLS YOU OTHERWISE. IF YOU DO NOT PAY**
27 **RENT, YOU CAN BE EVICTED. BE SURE TO KEEP PROOF OF ANY PAYMENTS YOU**
28 **MAKE.**

29 **SECURITY DEPOSIT**

30 **You may apply your security deposit and any rent you paid in advance against the cur-**
31 **rent rent you owe your landlord as provided in ORS 90.367. To do this, you must notify your**
32 **landlord in writing that you want to subtract the amount of your security deposit or prepaid**
33 **rent from your rent payment. You may do this only for the rent you owe your current**
34 **landlord. If you do this, you must do so before the foreclosure sale. The business or individ-**
35 **ual who buys this property at the foreclosure sale is not responsible to you for any deposit**
36 **or prepaid rent you paid to your landlord.**

37 **ABOUT YOUR TENANCY**
38 **AFTER THE FORECLOSURE SALE**

39 **The new owner that buys this property at the foreclosure sale may be willing to allow**
40 **you to stay as a tenant instead of requiring you to move out after 90 days or at the end of**
41 **your fixed term lease. After the sale, you should receive a written notice informing you that**
42 **the sale took place and giving you the new owner's name and contact information. You**
43 **should contact the new owner if you would like to stay. If the new owner accepts rent from**
44 **you, signs a new residential rental agreement with you or does not notify you in writing**
45 **within 30 days after the date of the foreclosure sale that you must move out, the new owner**

1 becomes your new landlord and must maintain the property. Otherwise:

- 2 • You do not owe rent;
- 3 • The new owner is not your landlord and is not responsible for maintaining the property
- 4 on your behalf; and
- 5 • You must move out by the date the new owner specifies in a notice to you.

6 The new owner may offer to pay your moving expenses and any other costs or amounts
7 you and the new owner agree on in exchange for your agreement to leave the premises in
8 less than 90 days or before your fixed term lease expires. You should speak with a lawyer to
9 fully understand your rights before making any decisions regarding your tenancy.

10 IT IS UNLAWFUL FOR ANY PERSON TO TRY TO FORCE YOU TO LEAVE YOUR
11 DWELLING UNIT WITHOUT FIRST GIVING YOU WRITTEN NOTICE AND GOING TO
12 COURT TO EVICT YOU. FOR MORE INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR RIGHTS, YOU SHOULD
13 CONSULT A LAWYER. If you believe you need legal assistance, contact the Oregon State
14 Bar and ask for the lawyer referral service. Contact information for the Oregon State Bar
15 is included with this notice. If you do not have enough money to pay a lawyer and are oth-
16 erwise eligible, you may be able to receive legal assistance for free. Information about whom
17 to contact for free legal assistance is included with this notice.

20 “**SECTION 2.** ORS 86.755 is amended to read:

21 “86.755. (1) The trustee shall hold the trustee’s sale on the date and at the time and place des-
22 ignated in the notice of sale[, *which must be at a designated time after 9 a.m. and before 4 p.m., based*
23 *on the standard of time set forth in ORS 187.110 and at a designated place in the county or one of the*
24 *counties where the property is situated*]. **The designated time of the trustee’s sale must be after**
25 **9 a.m. and before 4 p.m., based on the standard of time set forth in ORS 187.110, and the**
26 **designated place of the trustee’s sale must be in the county or one of the counties in which**
27 **the property is situated.** The trustee may sell the property in one parcel or in separate parcels
28 and shall sell the parcel or parcels at auction to the highest bidder for cash. Any person, including
29 the beneficiary under the trust deed, but excluding the trustee, may bid at the trustee’s sale. The
30 attorney for the trustee, or an agent that the trustee or the attorney designates, may conduct the
31 sale and act in the sale as the trustee’s auctioneer.

32 “(2) The trustee or the attorney for the trustee, or an agent that the trustee or the attorney
33 conducting the sale designates, may postpone the sale for one or more periods totaling not more
34 than 180 days from the original sale date, giving notice of each adjournment by public proclamation
35 made at the time and place set for sale. The trustee, the attorney or an agent that the trustee or
36 the attorney designates may make the proclamation.

37 “(3) The purchaser shall pay at the time of sale the price bid, and, within 10 days following
38 payment, the trustee shall execute and deliver the trustee’s deed to the purchaser.

39 “(4) The trustee’s deed shall convey to the purchaser the interest in the property that the
40 grantor had, or had the power to convey, at the time the grantor executed the trust deed, together
41 with any interest the grantor or the grantor’s successors in interest acquire after the execution of
42 the trust deed.

43 “(5)(a) **If property purchased at the trustee’s sale includes one or more dwelling units**
44 **that are subject to ORS chapter 90, the purchaser must provide written notice of change in**
45 **ownership to the occupants of each unit within 30 days after the date of sale and before or**

1 concurrently with service of a written termination notice authorized by subsection (6)(c)(B)
2 of this section.

3 **“(b) The notice required by this subsection must:**

4 **“(A) Explain that the dwelling unit has been sold at a foreclosure sale and that the pur-**
5 **chaser at that sale is the new owner.**

6 **“(B) Include the date on which the foreclosure sale took place.**

7 **“(C) Include the name, contact address and contact telephone number of the purchaser**
8 **or the purchaser’s representative.**

9 **“(D) Provide information about the rights of bona fide residential tenants as provided in**
10 **subsections (6)(c) and (e) and (9)(a) of this section.**

11 **“(E) Include contact information for the Oregon State Bar and a person or organization**
12 **that provides legal help to individuals at no charge to the individual.**

13 **“(c) The notice must be served by one or more of the following methods:**

14 **“(A) Personal delivery to the tenant.**

15 **“(B) First class mail to the tenant at the dwelling unit.**

16 **“(C) First class mail to the tenant at the dwelling unit and attachment of a second notice**
17 **copy. The second notice copy must be attached in a secure manner to the main entrance to**
18 **the portion of the premises in the possession of the tenant.**

19 **“(D) If the names of the tenants are not known to the purchaser, the notice may be ad-**
20 **dressed to ‘occupants.’**

21 **“(d) A notice that contains the information required under paragraph (b)(B) and (C) of**
22 **this subsection meets the requirements of paragraph (b) of this subsection if the notice is**
23 **in substantially the following form:**

26 **NOTICE TO RESIDENTIAL TENANTS OF CHANGE IN OWNERSHIP**

27 **The property in which you are living has gone through foreclosure and was sold to a new**
28 **owner on _____ (date). The contact information for the new owner or the owner’s repre-**
29 **sentative is _____ (name, address, telephone number).**

30 **IF YOU ARE A BONA FIDE TENANT RENTING THIS PROPERTY AS A RESIDENTIAL**
31 **DWELLING, YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO CONTINUE LIVING IN THIS PROPERTY AFTER**
32 **THE FORECLOSURE SALE FOR:**

- 33 • **THE REMAINDER OF YOUR FIXED TERM LEASE, IF YOU HAVE A FIXED**
34 **TERM LEASE; OR**
35 • **AT LEAST 90 DAYS FROM THE DATE YOU ARE GIVEN A WRITTEN TERMI-**
36 **NATION NOTICE.**

37 **If the new owner wants to move in and use this property as a primary residence, the new**
38 **owner can give you written notice and require you to move out after 90 days, even though**
39 **you have a fixed term lease with more than 90 days left.**

40 **You must be provided with at least 90 days’ written notice after the foreclosure sale be-**
41 **fore you can be required to move.**

42 **A bona fide tenant is a residential tenant who is not the borrower (property owner), or**
43 **a child, spouse or parent of the borrower, and whose rental agreement:**

- 44 • **Is the result of an arm’s-length transaction;**
45 • **Requires the payment of rent that is not substantially less than fair market rent**

4 **IMPORTANT:**

7 **OWNER KNOW IF YOU ARE A BONA FIDE TENANT. YOU SHOULD PROVIDE WRITTEN**
8 **EVIDENCE OF THE EXISTENCE OF YOUR RENTAL AGREEMENT, ESPECIALLY IF YOU**
9 **HAVE A FIXED TERM RENTAL AGREEMENT OR LEASE WITH MORE THAN 90 DAYS**
10 **LEFT. Written evidence of your rental agreement can be a copy of your lease or rental**
11 **agreement, or other documentation of the existence of your rental agreement. Keep your**
12 **original documents and a record of any information you give to the new owner.**

13 **YOUR TENANCY**

14 **BETWEEN NOW AND THE MOVE-OUT DATE**

15 **The new owner may be willing to allow you to stay as a tenant instead of requiring you**
16 **to move out after 90 days or at the end of your fixed term lease. You should contact the new**
17 **owner if you would like to stay. If the new owner accepts rent from you, signs a new resi-**
18 **dential rental agreement with you or does not notify you in writing within 30 days after the**
19 **date of the foreclosure sale that you must move out, the new owner becomes your new**
20 **landlord and must maintain the property. Otherwise:**

- 21 • **You do not owe rent;**
 - 22 • **The new owner is not your landlord and is not responsible for maintaining the property;**
- 23 **and**
- 24 • **You must move out by the date the new owner specifies in a notice to you.**

25 **The new owner may offer to pay your moving expenses and any other costs or amounts**
26 **you and the new owner agree on in exchange for your agreement to leave the premises in**
27 **less than 90 days or before your fixed term lease expires. You should speak with a lawyer to**
28 **fully understand your rights before making any decisions regarding your tenancy.**

29 **IT IS UNLAWFUL FOR ANY PERSON TO TRY TO FORCE YOU TO LEAVE YOUR**
30 **DWELLING UNIT WITHOUT FIRST GIVING YOU WRITTEN NOTICE AND GOING TO**

39 “[5)(a)] (6)(a) **Except as provided in paragraph (b) or (c) of this subsection,** the purchaser
40 at the trustee’s sale is entitled to possession of the property on the 10th day after the sale. A person
41 that remains in possession after the 10th day under any interest, except an interest **created** prior
42 to the trust deed or an interest the grantor or a successor of the grantor created voluntarily is a
43 tenant at sufferance. The purchaser may obtain possession of the property from a tenant at
44 sufferance by following the procedures set forth in ORS 105.105 to 105.168 or other applicable judi-
45 cial procedure.

1 “(b) Except as provided in paragraph (c) of this subsection, at any time after the trustee’s sale
2 the purchaser may follow the procedures set forth in ORS 105.105 to 105.168 or other applicable
3 judicial procedure to obtain possession of the property from a person that holds possession under
4 an interest that the grantor or a successor of the grantor created voluntarily if, not earlier than 30
5 days before the date first set for the sale, the person was served with not less than 30 days’ written
6 notice of the requirement to surrender or deliver possession of the property.

7 “[(c) *If the property purchased at the trustee’s sale is a dwelling unit, as defined in ORS 90.100*
8 *(9), that the person holds under a tenancy that the grantor or a successor of the grantor created vol-*
9 *untarily and in good faith, the purchaser may follow the procedures set forth in ORS 105.105 to 105.168*
10 *or other applicable judicial procedure to obtain possession if after the sale the purchaser terminates the*
11 *tenancy in a written notice given to the person.*]

12 “[(A) *At least 60 days before the termination date specified in the notice, if the tenancy is a fixed*
13 *term tenancy, as defined in ORS 90.100, and at least 30 days before the date first set for the trustee’s*
14 *sale the person provided the trustee with a copy of the rental agreement that established the fixed term*
15 *tenancy. The provisions of this subparagraph do not apply to a purchaser that does not intend to ter-*
16 *minate a fixed term tenancy before the date on which the fixed term tenancy ends.*]

17 “[(B) *At least 30 days before the termination date specified in the notice, if:*]

18 “[(i) *The tenancy is a month-to-month tenancy or week-to-week tenancy, as those terms are defined*
19 *in ORS 90.100, and at least 30 days before the date first set for the trustee’s sale the person provided*
20 *the trustee with a copy of the rental agreement that established the tenancy or with other written evi-*
21 *dence of the existence of a rental agreement, if the person cannot provide the rental agreement; or]*

22 “[(ii) *The tenancy is a fixed term tenancy for which the person has provided notice to the trustee*
23 *as provided in subparagraph (A) of this paragraph and the purchaser intends to occupy the property*
24 *that is subject to the fixed term tenancy as the purchaser’s primary residence.*]

25 **“(c) If the property purchased at the trustee’s sale includes a dwelling unit that is subject**
26 **to ORS chapter 90 and an individual occupies the unit under a bona fide tenancy, the pur-**
27 **chaser may obtain possession by following the procedures set forth in ORS 105.105 to 105.168**
28 **and by using the complaint form provided in ORS 105.124 or 105.126:**

29 **“(A) Upon expiration of the fixed term of the tenancy, if the bona fide tenancy is a fixed**
30 **term tenancy as defined in ORS 90.100; or**

31 **“(B) At least 90 days after service of a written termination notice if the bona fide tenancy**
32 **is:**

33 **“(i) A fixed term tenancy and the purchaser intends to occupy, as the purchaser’s pri-**
34 **mary residence, the dwelling unit that is subject to the fixed term tenancy; or**

35 **“(ii) A month-to-month tenancy or week-to-week tenancy, as those terms are defined in**
36 **ORS 90.100.**

37 **“(d) If a purchaser gives a 90-day written termination notice pursuant to paragraph (c)**
38 **of this subsection, the purchaser may include in the notice a request that a tenant with a**
39 **fixed term tenancy provide written evidence of the existence of the tenancy to the purchaser**
40 **at an address described in the notice. Written evidence includes a copy of the rental**
41 **agreement or another document that shows the existence of the fixed term tenancy. Failure**
42 **of the tenant to provide the requested written evidence before the purchaser files an action**
43 **for possession based on a 90-day notice:**

44 **“(A) Does not prevent the tenant from asserting the existence of the fixed term tenancy**
45 **as a defense to the action.**

1 **“(B) Prevents the tenant from recovering prevailing party attorney fees or costs and**
2 **disbursements pursuant to subsection (11)(b) of this section. The 90-day notice must describe**
3 **the provisions of this paragraph.**

4 “[(d)] (e) A purchaser may not commence a proceeding under ORS 105.105 to 105.168 that is
5 authorized under this subsection before the later of:

6 “(A) The 10th day after the trustee’s sale;

7 “(B) The date specified in a written notice of the requirement to surrender or deliver possession
8 of the property if the notice is required by and is given to the person in accordance with paragraph
9 (b) of this subsection;

10 “(C) The date specified in a written notice of the purchaser’s intent to terminate a tenancy if
11 the notice is required by and is given to the person in accordance with paragraph (c) of this sub-
12 section; or

13 “(D) The date on which the term of a fixed term tenancy ends, if the property is a dwelling unit
14 and the purchaser has not terminated the tenancy in accordance with paragraph (c) of this sub-
15 section.

16 **“(f) A purchaser seeking to obtain possession pursuant to ORS 105.105 to 105.168 must**
17 **attach proof of service of a written termination notice required by paragraph (c) of this**
18 **subsection to the pleadings.**

19 **“(g) In an action to obtain possession, violation of the procedures required by subsection**
20 **(5) of this section or paragraph (c) of this subsection is a defense for a bona fide tenant**
21 **seeking to retain possession.**

22 **“(h) As used in this subsection, ‘bona fide tenancy’ means tenancy of a dwelling unit that**
23 **is subject to ORS chapter 90 that results from an arm’s-length transaction that occurred**
24 **before the date of a foreclosure sale in which:**

25 **“(A) The mortgagor or the child, spouse or parent of the mortgagor under the contract**
26 **is not the tenant; and**

27 **“(B) The rent required is not substantially less than fair market rent for the dwelling**
28 **unit, unless the rent is reduced or subsidized due to a federal, state or local subsidy.**

29 “[(e) For the purposes of this subsection:]

30 “[(A) A month-to-month tenancy or a week-to-week tenancy that a grantor or a successor of the
31 grantor first created after a notice of sale was served under ORS 86.750 is presumed not to be a
32 tenancy created in good faith.]

33 “[(B) A fixed term tenancy that a grantor or a successor of the grantor created after a notice of
34 sale was served under ORS 86.750 is not a tenancy created in good faith.]

16 “(2)(a) Except as otherwise provided in this section, a landlord may require a tenant to pay a

19 to the rental agreement. A tenant’s claim to the security deposit or prepaid rent is prior to the claim

29 **or 60** days [*or before your fixed term lease expires*]. You should speak with a lawyer to fully under-
30 stand your rights before making any decisions regarding your tenancy.

31 IT IS UNLAWFUL FOR ANY PERSON TO TRY TO FORCE YOU TO LEAVE YOUR
32 DWELLING UNIT WITHOUT FIRST GIVING YOU WRITTEN NOTICE AND GOING TO COURT
33 TO EVICT YOU. FOR MORE INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR RIGHTS, YOU SHOULD CONSULT
34 A LAWYER. If you believe you need legal assistance, contact the Oregon State Bar and ask for the
35 lawyer referral service. Contact information for the Oregon State Bar is included with this notice.

41 “**SECTION 7.** ORS 86.755, as amended by section 2 of this 2011 Act, is amended to read:

42 “86.755. (1) The trustee shall hold the trustee's sale on the date and at the time and place des-
43 ignated in the notice of sale. The designated time of the trustee's sale must be after 9 a.m. and be-
44 fore 4 p.m., based on the standard of time set forth in ORS 187.110, and the designated place of the
45 trustee's sale must be in the county or one of the counties in which the property is situated. The

1 trustee may sell the property in one parcel or in separate parcels and shall sell the parcel or parcels
2 at auction to the highest bidder for cash. Any person, including the beneficiary under the trust deed,
3 but excluding the trustee, may bid at the trustee's sale. The attorney for the trustee, or an agent
4 that the trustee or the attorney designates, may conduct the sale and act in the sale as the trustee's
5 auctioneer.

6 "(2) The trustee or the attorney for the trustee, or an agent that the trustee or the attorney
7 conducting the sale designates, may postpone the sale for one or more periods totaling not more
8 than 180 days from the original sale date, giving notice of each adjournment by public proclamation
9 made at the time and place set for sale. The trustee, the attorney or an agent that the trustee or
10 the attorney designates may make the proclamation.

11 "(3) The purchaser shall pay at the time of sale the price bid, and, within 10 days following
12 payment, the trustee shall execute and deliver the trustee's deed to the purchaser.

13 "(4) The trustee's deed shall convey to the purchaser the interest in the property that the
14 grantor had, or had the power to convey, at the time the grantor executed the trust deed, together
15 with any interest the grantor or the grantor's successors in interest acquire after the execution of

17 "(5)(a) If property purchased at the trustee's sale includes one or more dwelling units that are
18 subject to ORS chapter 90, the purchaser must provide written notice of change in ownership to the

39 "(d) A notice that contains the information required under paragraph (b)(B) and (C) of this sub-
40 section meets the requirements of paragraph (b) of this subsection if the notice is in substantially

12 If the new owner wants to move in and use this property as a primary residence, the new owner
13 can give you written notice and require you to move out after [90] 30 days, even though you have

21 an interest that the grantor or a successor of the grantor created voluntarily if, not earlier than 30
22 days before the date first set for the sale, the person was served with not less than 30 days’ written
23 notice of the requirement to surrender or deliver possession of the property.

24 “(c) If the property purchased at the trustee’s sale includes a dwelling unit that is subject to
25 ORS chapter 90 and an individual occupies the unit under a bona fide tenancy, the purchaser may
26 obtain possession by following the procedures set forth in ORS 105.105 to 105.168 and by using the
27 complaint form provided in ORS 105.124 or 105.126:

28 “(A) *[Upon expiration of the fixed term of the tenancy,]* **At least 60 days after service of a**
29 **written termination notice**, if the bona fide tenancy is a fixed term tenancy as defined in ORS
30 90.100; or

31 “(B) At least *[90]* **30 days** after service of a written termination notice if the bona fide tenancy
32 is:

33 “(i) A fixed term tenancy and the purchaser intends to occupy, as the purchaser’s primary resi-
34 dence, the dwelling unit that is subject to the fixed term tenancy; or

35 “(ii) A month-to-month tenancy or week-to-week tenancy, as those terms are defined in ORS
36 90.100.

37 “(d) If a purchaser gives a *[90-day]* **30-day** written termination notice pursuant to paragraph (c)
38 of this subsection, the purchaser may include in the notice a request that a tenant with a fixed term
39 tenancy provide written evidence of the existence of the tenancy to the purchaser at an address
40 described in the notice. Written evidence includes a copy of the rental agreement or another docu-
41 ment that shows the existence of the fixed term tenancy. Failure of the tenant to provide the re-
42 quested written evidence before the purchaser files an action for possession based on a *[90-day]*
43 **30-day** notice:

44 “(A) Does not prevent the tenant from asserting the existence of the fixed term tenancy as a
45 defense to the action.

1 “(B) Prevents the tenant from recovering prevailing party attorney fees or costs and disburse-
2 ments pursuant to subsection (11)(b) of this section. The [90-day] **30-day** notice must describe the
3 provisions of this paragraph.

4 “(e) A purchaser may not commence a proceeding under ORS 105.105 to 105.168 that is author-
5 ized under this subsection before the later of:

6 “(A) The 10th day after the trustee’s sale;

7 “(B) The date specified in a written notice of the requirement to surrender or deliver possession
8 of the property if the notice is required by and is given to the person in accordance with paragraph
9 (b) of this subsection;

10 “(C) The date specified in a written notice of the purchaser’s intent to terminate a tenancy if
11 the notice is required by and is given to the person in accordance with paragraph (c) of this sub-
12 section; or

13 “(D) The date on which the term of a fixed term tenancy ends, if the property is a dwelling unit
14 and the purchaser has not terminated the tenancy in accordance with paragraph (c) of this sub-
15 section.

16 “(f) A purchaser seeking to obtain possession pursuant to ORS 105.105 to 105.168 must attach
17 proof of service of a written termination notice required by paragraph (c) of this subsection to the
18 pleadings.

19 “(g) In an action to obtain possession, violation of the procedures required by subsection (5) of
20 this section or paragraph (c) of this subsection is a defense for a bona fide tenant seeking to retain
21 possession.

22 “(h) As used in this subsection, ‘bona fide tenancy’ means tenancy of a dwelling unit that is
23 subject to ORS chapter 90 that results from an arm’s-length transaction that occurred before the
24 date of a foreclosure sale in which:

25 “(A) The mortgagor or the child, spouse or parent of the mortgagor under the contract is not
26 the tenant; and

27 “(B) The rent required is not substantially less than fair market rent for the dwelling unit, un-
28 less the rent is reduced or subsidized due to a federal, state or local subsidy.

29 “(7) A purchaser shall serve a notice under subsection (6) of this section by one or more of the
30 following methods:

31 “(a) Personal delivery to the tenant.

32 “(b) First class mail to the tenant at the dwelling unit.

33 “(c) First class mail to the tenant at the dwelling unit and attachment of a second notice copy.
34 The second notice copy must be attached in a secure manner to the main entrance to the portion
35 of the premises in the possession of the tenant.

36 “(8) If the notice under subsection (6) of this section is served by mail pursuant to subsection
37 (7)(b) of this section, the minimum period for compliance must be extended by three days and the
38 notice must include the extension in the period stated in the notice.

39 “(9)(a) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (6)(c) of this section and except as provided
40 in paragraph (b) of this subsection, the purchaser is not a landlord subject to the provisions of ORS
41 chapter 90 unless the purchaser:

42 “(A) Accepts rent from the individual who possesses the property under a tenancy described in
43 subsection (6)(c) of this section;

44 “(B) Enters into a new rental agreement with the individual who possesses the property under
45 a tenancy described in subsection (6)(c) of this section; or

1 “(C) Fails to terminate the tenancy as provided in subsection (6)(c) of this section within 30 days
2 after the date of the sale.

3 “(b) The purchaser may act as a landlord for purposes of terminating a tenancy in accordance
4 with the provisions of ORS 90.396.

5 “(c) The purchaser is subject to the provisions of ORS 90.322, 90.375, 105.165, 659A.421 and
6 659A.425. The application of ORS 90.375 to a purchaser that does not become a landlord does not
7 impose an affirmative duty to pay for or provide services. For the purpose of damages pursuant to
8 this paragraph, ‘rent’ refers to the amount paid by the tenant to the landlord for the right to occupy
9 the unit before the foreclosure.

10 “(10)(a) Except as provided in paragraph (b) of this subsection, the purchaser is not liable to the
11 individual who possesses the property under a tenancy described in subsection (6)(c) of this section
12 for:

13 “(A) Damage to the property or diminution in rental value; or

14 “(B) Returning a security deposit.

15 “(b) A purchaser that is a landlord under the provisions of subsection (9)(a) of this section is
16 liable to the individual who possesses the property under a tenancy described in subsection (6)(c)
17 of this section for:

18 “(A) Damage to the property or diminution in rental value that occurs after the date of the
19 trustee’s sale; or

20 “(B) Returning a security deposit the individual pays after the date of the trustee’s sale.

21 “(11)(a) Except as provided in paragraph (b) of this subsection and notwithstanding an agree-
22 ment to the contrary, in an action or defense arising pursuant to subsection (6)(c), (d), (f) or (g), (7)
23 or (9)(c) of this section, reasonable attorney fees at trial and on appeal may be awarded to the
24 prevailing party together with costs and disbursements.

25 “(b) If a tenant asserts a successful defense to an action for possession pursuant to subsection
26 (6)(c), (d), (f) or (g) of this section, the tenant is not entitled to prevailing party fees, attorney fees
27 or costs and disbursements if the purchaser:

28 “(A) Did not know, and did not have reasonable cause to know, of the existence of a fixed term
29 tenancy when commencing the action for possession; and

30 “(B) Promptly dismissed the action upon becoming aware of the existence of a fixed term
31 tenancy.

32 “(c) As used in this subsection, ‘prevailing party’ means the party in whose favor final judgment
33 is rendered.

34 “(12)(a) Notwithstanding subsection (2) of this section, except when a beneficiary has partic-
35 ipated in obtaining a stay, foreclosure proceedings that are stayed by order of the court, by pro-
36 ceedings in bankruptcy or for any other lawful reason shall, after release from the stay, continue
37 as if uninterrupted, if within 30 days after release the trustee sends amended notice of sale by reg-
38 istered or certified mail to the last-known address of the persons listed in ORS 86.740 and 86.750 (1).

39 “(b) In addition to the notice required under paragraph (a) of this subsection, the trustee shall
40 send amended notice of sale:

41 “(A) By registered or certified mail to:

42 “(i) The address provided by each person who was present at the time and place set for the sale
43 that was stayed; and

44 “(ii) The address provided by each member of the Oregon State Bar who by registered or certi-
45 fied mail requests the amended notice of sale and includes with the request the notice of default or

1 an identification number for the trustee's sale that would assist the trustee in identifying the prop-
2 erty subject to the trustee's sale and a self-addressed, stamped envelope measuring at least 8.5 by
3 11 inches in size; or

4 "(B) By posting a true copy or a link to a true copy of the amended notice of sale on the
5 trustee's Internet website.

6 "(13) The amended notice of sale must:

7 "(a) Be given at least 20 days prior to the amended date of sale;

8 "(b) Set an amended date of sale that may be the same as the original sale date, or date to which
9 the sale was postponed, provided the requirements of this subsection and ORS 86.740 and 86.750 are
10 satisfied;

11 "(c) Specify the time and place for sale;

12 "(d) Conform to the requirements of ORS 86.745; and

13 "(e) State that the original sale proceedings were stayed and the date the stay terminated.

14 "(14) If the publication of the notice of sale was not completed before the date the foreclosure
15 proceedings were stayed by order of the court, by proceedings in bankruptcy or for any other lawful
16 reason, after release from the stay, in addition to complying with the provisions of subsections (12)
17 and (13) of this section, the trustee shall complete the publication by publishing an amended notice
18 of sale that states that the notice has been amended following release from the stay and that con-
19 tains the amended date of sale. The amended notice must be published in a newspaper of general
20 circulation in each of the counties in which the property is situated once a week for four successive
21 weeks, except that the required number of publications must be reduced by the number of publica-
22 tions that were completed before the effective date of the stay. The last publication must be made
23 more than 20 days before the date the trustee conducts the sale.

24 "**SECTION 8. Notwithstanding the amendments to ORS 105.124 and 105.126 by sections 3
25 and 4 of this 2011 Act, for the purpose of exhausting existing supplies of the complaint forms
26 modified pursuant to the amendments to ORS 105.124 and 105.126 by sections 3 and 4 of this
27 2011 Act, complaint forms satisfying the requirements of ORS 105.124 or 105.126, as in effect
28 on January 2, 2011, may be used until January 2, 2012.**

29 "**SECTION 9. The amendments to ORS 86.745 and 86.755 by sections 6 and 7 of this 2011
30 Act become operative January 1, 2015.**

31 "**SECTION 10. This 2011 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
32 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2011 Act takes effect
33 90 days after passage.**"
